- 1. The defendant admits that it took possession of a mobile home located in Baldwin County, Alabama, in November, 1971. The defendant denies the remaining allegations of the plaintiffs' First Cause of Action.
- 2. The defendant denies the allegations of paragraph numbered 2 of plaintiffs' amended complaint.
