Be it remembered that a Court was begun and held for the County of Baldwin, State of Alabama, on the Fourth Monday in October, 1908, the same being the 26th day of the month; His Honor Samuel B. Browne, Judge Presiding, also were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said County, when the following proceedings were had: And now comes Thomas A. Booth Sheriff of said County, and returns into Court his return facies served upon the following good and lawful men who had been duly and regularly drawn in accordance with law to serve as Grand Jurors at the present term of the Circuit Court to-wit: C. S. Thompson, P. W. McAdams, John Mobley, J. T. Bradley, Chas. Head, James Bryant, Jos. Lemmear, M. C. Underwood, Oscar Johnson, F. D. Troup, Thos. Hadley, H. B. Gunn, G. B. Hildreth, W. B. Thowley, N. Merston, G. R. Suarez, J. B. Lipscomb, and Tillman Lambert. All of whom answered to their names except M. C. Underwood and proof having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that the said M. C. Underwood has a good and sufficient excuse for his non attendance. It is ordered by the Court that he be and is excused. It is further ordered by the Court that P. W. McAdams (who was present in Court) be and he is excused upon a sufficient excuse being rendered. And the following of said persons so summoned to serve as Grand Jurors

were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally, empanelled, sworn and charged by the Court. J. T. Bradley having been appointed and sworn by the Court as Foreman of said Grand Jury; C. S. Thompson, John Mobley, Chas. Head, James B. Byers, J. C. Ginnear, Oscar Johnson, J. L. Group, Thos. Hadley, W. B. Gunn, G. B. Childress, G. R. Thomley, N. Mershon, G. R. Squires, J. P. Lipscomb and Tillman Lambert. And the said Grand Jury then retired under the charge of W. C. Booth who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand Jury.

And the said Grand Jury ~~then~~ among other indictments returned the following:
