Swift have good and sufficient excuse for their non attendance  
It is ordered by the Court that they be and are excused.  
And the following of said persons so summoned to  
serve as Grand Jurors were then duly examined as to qual-  
ification by the Court and were then and there duly and  
legally impanelled, sworn and charged by the Court. T. H.  
Boyles having been appointed and sworn by the Court
