Be it remembered that a Court was begun and held for the County of Baldwin, State of Alabama on the Fourth Monday in March, 1908 the same being the 23rd day of the Month, His Honor Saml. B. Browne, Judge presiding, also were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said County, when the following proceedings were had: And now comes Thomas A. Booth, Sheriff of said County, and returns into Court his venue facies served upon the following good and lawful men who had been duly and regularly drawn in accordance with law to serve as Grand Jurors at the present term of the Circuit Court to wit: R. L. Yumley Jr., H. W. Slaughter, Orie Stapleton, J. L. Ferguson, N. C. Winnie, Chas. F. Swan, H. J. Clwerdon, J. M. McPherson, Hector Smith, H. M. Gilley, H. B. Staples, E. M. Strong, Geo. A. Johnson, J. B. Vaughn, Geo. H. Hoyle, E. M. Hayes, J. A. Underwood, E. M. Watts, and Joseph Menzel, all of whom answered to their names except H. W. Slaughter, Hector Smith, and Theo. A.

Johnson, and proof having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that the said St. M. Slaughter, Hector Smith and Geo. W. Johnson, have good and sufficient excuse for their non-attendance it is ordered by the Court that they be and are excused. And the following of said persons so summoned to serve as Grand Jurors were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally empanelled, sworn and charged by the Court, M. C. Minwiddie having been appointed and sworn by the Court as foreman of said Grand Jury: P. L. Yuille, Jr. Cyril Stapleton, T. L. Ferguson, Chas. F. Swan, W. D. Cleveland, L. O. McPherson, H. M. Gilly, W. C. Staples, E. M. Strong, J. B. Vaughan, Geo. St. Hoyle, S. M. Hayes, J. H. Underwood, E. M. Matters and Joseph Kengel. And the said Grand Jury then retired under the charge of Walter H. Sibley who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand Jury. And the said Grand Jury among other indictments returned the following:-

The Grand Jury of said County charge that, before the finding of this indictment, J. T. Bowman whose name is to this Grand Jury otherwise unknown, did with intent to injure them, or defraud them, enter into a contract in writing, for the performance of certain acts or service stipulated therein with J. T. Wilson & Co a partnership firm composed of J. T. Wilson & L. K. Irwin and did thereby, obtain from them money or other personal property and with like intent and without just cause and without refunding such money or paying for such property did refuse or fail to perform such act or service with said employees.

2. And said Grand Jury further charge that, before the finding of this indictment J. T. Bowman, whose Christian name is to this Grand Jury otherwise unknown, did with intent to injure or defraud them, enter into a contract in writing for the performance of certain acts or of personal service as stipulated therein with J. T. Wilson & Co a partnership firm composed of J. T. Wilson and L. K. Irwin and did by reason of said contract in writing, obtain from them (the said J. T. Wilson & Co) money or other personal property and with like intent and without just cause and without refunding such money or paying for such property did refuse or

fail to perform such acts or personal service with said employees against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
