Slaughter his securities acknowledge ourselves indebted to the State of Alabama in the sum of One Hundred Dollars to be void if the said John Boston appear before the next term of the Circuit Court, 1908 and from time to time thereafter until legally discharged, and answer the charge of selling Whiskey preferred against him by Roland Rice and as a part of the consideration of this bond we, the principal and securities, do hereby waive all our exemption and homestead rights under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Alabama, to any property, real or personal as to the collection of the penalty of this bond. Be it remembered that a Court was begun and held for the County of Baldwin State of Alabama on the Fourth Monday in October 1908 the same being the 26th day of the Month, His Honor Samuel B Browne Judge Presiding also were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said County when the following proceedings were had:

And now comes Thomas A Barth Sheriff of said County and returns into Court his venire facies served upon the following good and lawful men who had been duly and regularly drawn in accordance with law to serve as Grand jurors at the present term of the Circuit Court to wit: A. S. Tompkins, P. H. McAdams, John Mobley, J. T. Bradley, Chas Head, James Bryars, Joe Fennimer, M. Underwood, Oscar Johnson, F. D. Troup, Thos Hadley, W. B. Ginn, G. B. Childress, W. B. Thomley, N. Mershon, G. R. Suarez, J. P. Lipscomb, and Tillman Lambert. All of whom answered to their names except M. Underwood and proof having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that the said M. Underwood has a good and sufficient excuse for his non attendance, it is ordered by the Court that he be and is excused. It is further ordered by the Court that P. H. McAdams (who was present in Court) be and he is excused upon a sufficient excuse being rendered. And the following of said persons so summoned to serve as Grand jurors were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally empanelled, sworn and charged by the Court. J. T. Bradley having been appointed and sworn by the Court as Foreman of said Grand Jury; A. S. Tompkins, John Mobley, Chas Head, James Bryars, Joe Fennimer, Oscar Johnson, F. D. Troup, Thos Hadley, W. B. Ginn, G. B. Childress, W. B. Thomley, N. Mershon, G. R. Suarez, J. P. Lipscomb, and Tillman Lambert. And the said Grand Jury then retired under the charge of W. C. Booth who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand Jury. And the said Grand Jury as indicted returned the following:-

The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this Indictment, John Boston sold spirituous, vinous, or malt liquors, without a license and Contrary to law.

And said Grand Jury further charge that, before the finding of this indictment sold, gave away or otherwise disposed of spirituous, vinous or malt liquors or intoxicating bit-
ters or beverages without a license and Contrary to law,
against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
