of Alabama in the sum of One Hundred and fifty dollars
for the payment of which well and truly to be made, we
jointly and severally bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and
administrators. Sealed with our seals and dated the 12 day
of April 1909. The condition of the above obligation is such
that whereas at the April term of the County Court of Baldwin
County, the said D. S. Comstock was convicted of the offense
of Petit Larceny; and whereas, the said D. S. Comstock has
on this day made application for an appeal from said conviction
to the next term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County
Now if the said D. S. Comstock shall personally appear
at the said term of said Circuit Court, and from term to

term thereafter, until discharged by law, to abide by and perform
whatever sentence may be adjudged against him, then this obligation
to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
And each of us hereby waive all rights to claim of exemption
we or either of us have now or may hereafter have, under the
Constitution and laws of Alabama and we certify we have
property free from all incumbrance to the full amount
of above bond.
