Be it remembered that a Court was begun and held for the County of Baldwin, State of Alabama, on the Fourth Monday in October, 1909 the same being the 25th day of the Month. His Honor Samuel B. Browne, Judge Presiding, also were present the Clerk, said Court and the Sheriff of said County when the following proceedings were had:

Roberts, B. L. Randall, M. H. Roach, J. H. Holman, Jas. M. Bishop, Frank Bryars, T. W. Richardson, J. H. McKenzie, John Wenzel, B. F. Freist, A. C. Nelson, all of whom answered to their names except Jas. M. Bishop and John Wenzel, and proof having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that the said Jas. M. Bishop and John Wenzel have good and sufficient excuse for their non-attendance, it is ordered by the Court that they be and are hereby excused. And the following of said persons so summoned to serve as Grand Jurors were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally empaneled, sworn and charged by the Court. B. F. Freist, having been appointed and sworn by the Court as foreman of said Grand Jury; Henry Lewis, Frank Earle, M. H. Hammock, Jack Kymn, A. B. Crosby, Joseph Wenzel, E. G. Strong, John Mesmonde, David Roberts, B. L. Randall, M. H. Roach, J. H. Holman, Frank Bryars, T. W. Richardson, J. H. McKenzie and A. C. Nelson. And the said Grand Jury then retired under the charge of Sam. Martin who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand Jury.

And the said Grand Jury among other indictments returned the following:
