Crowne, Judge Presiding also were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said County when the following proceedings were had: And now comes Thomas A. Roark Sheriff of said County and returns into Court his name ~~faces~~ served upon the following good and lawful men who had been duly and regularly drawn in accordance with law to serve as Grand Jurors at the present term of the Circuit Court to wit: Henry Lewis, Frank Earle, Jack Myers, A. B. Crossby, Joseph Kengel, E. G. Strong, John J. Remondos, Byard Roberts, B. L. Randall, M. H. Roach, J. J. Holman, Jas M. Bishop, Frank Dryars, J. W. Richardson, T. A. McTigue, John Kengel, B. H. Heist, A. B. Nelson all of whom answered to their names except Jas M. Bishop and John Kengel, And proof having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that the said Jas M. Bishop and John Kengel have good and sufficient excuse for

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their non attendance. It is ordered by the Court that they be and are hereby excused. And the following of said persons so summoned to serve as Grand Jurors were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally empanelled sworn and charged by the Court, B. F. Feist having been appointed and sworn by the Court as foreman of said Grand Jury: Henry Lewis, Frank Earles, H. G. Stumyres, Jack Hymn, A. P. Crosby, Joseph Kenzie, E. G. Strong, John J. Resmondo, Ryard Roberts, B. L. Randall, M. H. Roach, J. H. Homan, Frank Byars, P. H. Richerson, J. A. McKenzie, and Al Nelson. And the said Grand Jury then retired under the charge of Sam Martin who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand Jury. And the said Grand Jury among other indictments returned the following:-

Indictment: The State of Alabama, (Circuit Court,
Baldwin County) Fall Term, 1909.

The Grand Jury of said County Charge that, before the finding of this Indictment, Rob Robbins alias Robert Robbins feloniously took and carried away lumber the personal property of John F. Davis of the value of five dollars against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
