Waldroup, Jas. A. Barney, J. L. Timney, R. T. Shepway, John Johnson, J. L. Davis, all of whom answered to their names except Aubrey Suarez and Chas. A. Swift. And proof having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that the said Aubrey Suarez and Chas. A. Swift, have good and sufficient excuse for their non attendance, It is ordered by the Court that they be and are hereby excused. And the following of said persons so summoned to serve as Grand Jurors were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally empanelled, sworn and charged by the Court, T. H. Bayles having been appointed and sworn by the Court as foreman of said Grand Jury: S. S. White, W. M. Gilmore, W. A. Trumstall

J. M. Standard, E. L. Ard, Louis Glendinning, Wm H. Harding, E. W. Peckerson, H. H. Howard, G. A. Ducent, H. W. Aldroup, J. A. Barney, J. G. Minney, R. T. Shipway, John Johnson and J. B. Davis. And the said Grand Jury then retired under the charge of W. C. Brown, who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand Jury.

The Grand Jury of said County charge that, before the finding of this Indictment Ed Murray Alias D' with intent to steal broke into and entered the store of Nelson, Franklin & Co. a Partnership composed of E. H. Nelson, J. M. Franklin and W. J. Cronkite in which goods, merchandise or clothing, things of value were kept for use, sale or deposit against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
