Be it remembered that a Court was begun and held for
 the County of Baldwin, State of Alabama, on the Fourth Monday in October
 1909 the same being the 25th day of the month; His Honor Judge
 B. B. Brown Judge Presiding also were present the Clerk of said Court
 and the Sheriff of said County when the following proceedings
 were had: And now comes Thomas A. Barth, Sheriff of
 said County and returns into Court his venire facias

 with law to serve as Grand Jurors at the present term

Geist, Al Nelson, all of whom answered to their names except Jas M Bishop and John Stengel, and proof having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that the said Jas M Bishop and John Stengel have good and sufficient excuse for their non attendance, it is ordered by the Court that they be and are hereby excused. And the following of said persons so summoned to serve as Grand Jurors were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally empanelled sworn and charged by the Court, B. T. Geist having been appointed and sworn by the Court as foreman of said Grand Jury: Henry Lewis, Frank Earle, A. G. Stannyses, Jack Wynn, Al Crosby, Joseph Stengel, Ed. S. And said Grand Jury further charge that, before the finding of this Indictment Norman Davis having entered into the dwelling house or on the premises of Archer W. Slaughter and Dupree Slaughter failed or refused without legal cause or good excuse to immediately leave upon being ordered or requested to do so by Archer W. Slaughter and Dupree Slaughter or the person in possession his agent or representative against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
