Bryant, thereupon, upon consideration thereof, it is ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that Mary Virginia Cox, a minor, who is over the age of eighteen years, be, and she is relieved of the disabilities of non-age, and she is vested with the power to sue and be sued, contract and be contracted with, to receive and take possession of any real and personal property to which she is entitled; to purchase real or personal estate, to sell and to convey, and to do all things, and to all intents and purposes as effectually as if she were twenty-one years of age.

It is further decreed that the said Julia B.Cox pay the costs of this proceeding, for which execution may issue.
