In signing the above Bond, we and each of us, agree to waive all legal rights of exemptions allowed us by the Constitution and Laws of Alabama.

Lea, W. W. Cooper, J. C. Lamphier, W. J. Kee, E. N. Nelson, W. C. Foster, B. F. Feist, D. W. Murphy, A. M. Brodbeck, A. C. Grimes, Geo Mc Gowan, J. D. Kelly, W. H. Harding, Jas A. Carney, Chas E. Eubanks, B. F. Patterson, A. B. Myles, M. N. Roach, and Martin Lowell. All of whom answered to their names except Jas A. Carney, and proof having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that the said Jas A. Carney has good and sufficient excuse for his non-attendance it is ordered by the Court that he be and is excused. M. N. Roach in open Court sub-

mitted reasons why he should not serve as a Grand Juror at the present term of this Court and asked the Court to excuse him, which upon consideration by the Court it is ordered by the Court that he be and is excused. And the following of said persons so summoned to serve as Grand Jurors were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally empanelled, sworn and charged by the Court, B. F. Feist having been appointed and sworn by the Court as foreman of said Grand Jury; John W. Lea, W. W. Cooper, J. C. Lauphien, W. J. Kee, E. H. Nelson, W. C. Foster, Dr. Murphy, A. M. Brodbeck, A. C. Grimes, Geo. M. Gowan, J. D. Kelly, W. H. Harding, Chas. E. Eubanks, B. J. Patterson, A. B. Myles, and Martin Lowell. And the said Grand Jury then retired under the charge of D. C. Byrne, who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand Jury.

And the said Grand Jury, among other indictments, returned the following:

1. The Grand Jury of said County charge that, before the finding of this indictment, J. P. Smith, whose Christian name is to this Grand Jury unknown, unlawfully and with malice aforethought killed Stuart M. Rae, by stabbing him with a knife.
2. And the Grand Jury of said County further charge that, before the finding of this indictment, Sige Smith alias J. P. Smith, whose true Christian name is unknown to this Grand Jury except as averred herein, unlawfully and with malice aforethought killed Stuart M. Rae, by cutting or stabbing him with a knife.
3. And said Grand Jury further charge that, before the finding of this indictment, one Smith, whose true Christian name is to this Grand Jury unknown, unlawfully and with malice aforethought, killed Stuart M. Rae, by cutting or stabbing him with a knife against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
