 through qualified jurors in attendance
 upon the Court. to form the jury requ-
 ired the Judge of the Court drew from

3 And said Grand jury further charges that before the finding of this indictment Joseph W. Frost and since August 9th 1909 sold offered for sale kept for sale or other unlawful disposition or otherwise disposed of prohibited liquors or beverage.

4 And the Grand jury further charges that before the finding of this indictment and after August 9th 1909 Joseph W. Frost sold kept for sale or other unlawful disposition or otherwise disposed of spirituous vinous or malt liquors. Contrary to law.
