While the oath set forth in section 7285 was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, and M. H. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury, thus organized, who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury room.

And the ^{said} Grand Jury further charges that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th 1909, Joseph Baldwin sold, offered for sale, kept for sale, or other unlawful disposition or otherwise disposed of spirituous, vinous, or malt liquors contrary to law.

And said Grand Jury further charges that, before the finding of this indictment, and since August 9th 1909, Joseph Baldwin maintained an unlawful drinking place contrary to law and the statutes in such cases made and provided.

And the Grand Jury further charges that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th 1909, Joseph Baldwin carried on the business of a retail dealer in malt liquors or of a retail dealer in prohibited liquors contrary to law.
