 John Pittman Jr, Wm. L. Barnette, Rosco Clizbie,
 appeared and in open Court submitted reasons
 why they should not serve as jurors it is ordered
 that they be and are ^{hereto} excused. And now after
 hearing excuses, claims of exemptions and
 disqualifications, and passing upon the same
 it appears to the Court that there are not enough
 qualified jurors in attendance upon the Court
 to form the juries required the Judge of
 the Court drew from the jury box the names
