Baldwin County Circuit Court Fall Term 1910
Be it remembered that at a regular term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County Alabama held at ^{the} said Courthouse of said County on the fourth Monday of October A.D. 1910, the same being the 24th day of said month His Honor Samuel B. Brown Judge presiding and also were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said County.

Previous to the adjournment of the last term of this Court, to wit on the 7th day of April A.D. 1910 the Judge of this drew from the jury box in open Court fifty cards on each of which was a name to supply the Grand Jury for this term and Petit Jurors for the first week. And the names of the persons drawn are Jesse E. Nelson, John H. Bishop, W. A. Siler, Leslie H. Bryan, Sam Martin, George Whittier

 appearing to the Court that said persons have
 a good and sufficient excuse for their non-
 attendance, at this term of the Court it is ordered
 that they be and are excused, and the following of
 said persons so drawn and summoned viz; Henry Brown
 J Assee Batson, John Pittman Jr, Wm L Barnette,
 Roscoe Clizbie, appeared and in open Court submitted
 reasons why they should not serve as Jurors &
 it is ordered that they be and are excused,
 And now after hearing & considering claims of exemption
 and disqualification and having upon the same
 it appears to the Court that there are not enough
 qualified Jurors in attendance upon the Court

to form the Juries required the Judge of the Court drew from the jury box the names of the following Jurors viz; George W Humphries, & George Huggins, Carlton L. Davis, Herbert Rice Eccles, John A. Chambers, Peter H. Jones, John W. Miller, James Thompson, John J. Campbell, Benjamin C. Britt, Arrie C. Hall, Wm. M. Burns, James L. Brown, Morgan Smith, Wm. P. Matthews, Will Cromartie, Wicard M. Oney, & Wm. who were then within or beside within five miles of the Court house to complete the Juries, then required the Sheriff forthwith to summon such Jurors to attend Court instantly, And now on this the 24th of October 1910, the Judge presiding in Open Court required that he called all the persons in attendance upon the Court named in the venire to be called and after hearing & curing claims of exemptions and disqualifications and having upon the same caused to be placed in a hat the cards containing the names of all the persons present, who were not excused by the Court, or exempt or disqualified and the Judge first drew from eighteen of said cards containing the following names, Jay P. Mix, Will J. Cromartie, John S. Hanson, Arrie C. Smith, Christopher Columbus Rogers, Robert L. Huford, Jules S. Phelps, James H. B. Barclay, W. Douglas Burant, Richard B. Pasgett, John G. Davison, Joe Dyess, John W. Baggett, Ray Brewster, Wm. M. Burns, Jay B. H. & Arrie C. Hall, and George W. Humphries who compose the Grand Jury for this term, And it appearing to this Court, that the Grand Jury is now complete, and is composed of the said eighteen named Jurors, the Court appointed George W. Humphries, as Foreman, of the Grand Jury, and administered to him the oath set forth in section 7284 of the Criminal Code of Alabama, while the oath set forth in section 7285 was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, and W. H. Williams was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance upon the Grand Jury, then organized, who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury room,

Indictment

The Grand Jury of Said County Charge that before the finding of this Indictment Fairmore with intent to injure or defraud McKenzie & son a firm composed of S. H. McKenzie and W. H. McKenzie his employer entered into a written contract with said McKenzie & son as afore said, on the 17th day of June 1910 for the performance of service as turpentine farm laborer to pull or chip boxes for ^{his} said employer McKenzie & son and bound himself by said contract to said McKenzie & son a firm composed of S. H. McKenzie and W. H. McKenzie as his employer and thereby by so contracting and agreeing with said McKenzie & son as his employer obtained from McKenzie & son a firm as aforesaid his employer Seventy Dollars in money, goods and chattels or other personal property, with the intent to injure or defraud his said employer the said McKenzie & son a firm as afore said, and without just cause and without refunding such money or paying for such property, refused or failed to perform such acts or services against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
