1910, the same being the 24th day of said month  
His Honor Samuel B Brown Judge presiding and also

last term of this Court, to wit on the 7th day of April

Wm P Hanson, Geo Burgett Jay Blue Grew  
and the Judge placed them in an envelope  
sealed same, and on the 5th day of October 1910  
delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who  
forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire facias  
containing the names of the persons drawn  
the day they are to appear, their occupation  
and the place of business and Residence  
And now comes Thos A Booth Sheriff of said  
County and returns into Court, his venire  
facias served upon of said jurors. Except  
Noah Silcox, H Lee Perry, Geo Burgett and  
Leslie H Bayars, all of whom answer to  
their names except James C Stapleton  
John B Shipp, Sam Crane Arthur Nixon  
and it appearing to the Court that said persons  
have a good and sufficient excuse for  
their non attendance at this term of the  
Court it is ordered that they be and are excused  
and the following of said persons so drawn  
and summoned; Henry Simpson Jesse Batson  
John Pittman Jr Wm L Barnett Rose Elzbie  
appeared and in open Court submitted reasons  
why they should not serve as jurors it is ordered  
that they be and are hereby excused  
And now after hearing excuses, claims of  
exemption and disqualifications, and passing  
upon the same it appears to the Court  
that there are not enough qualified jurors  
in attendance upon the Court to form the  
juries required the Judge of the Court drew from  
the jury box the names of the following jurors viz,  
George W Humphries, Eltona Higgins  
Arthur Swin, Herbert Hillcrease, John Schumaker  
Pete St Jones, John D Miller James M Thompson  
John J Campbell, Benjamin C Britt Orrie Stall  
Wm M Burns, James L Brown, Morgan Nixon  
Am Phathew, Will Cronkite, Willard Wouley  
J P Mix who were then within or resided within  
five miles of the Court House to complete all

juries, then required the Sheriff forthwith to summon  
such jurors to attend Court instant. And on  
on this the 24th of October 1910 the judge presiding  
in open Court required to be called all the persons  
in attendance upon the Court named in the venire  
to be called and after hearing excuse claims  
of exemption and disqualifications, and  
passing up on the same caused to be placed  
in a hat the cards containing the names of all  
the persons present, who were not excused by the Court  
or exempt or disqualified and the judge first  
drew there from sight one of said cards

containing the following names.  
Jay P. Mix, Will J. Cromartie, Chas. P. Hanson  
Allen L. Grimes, Christopher Columbus Rogers.  
Robert L. Dufrenoy, Jiles L. Phillips  
James Holton, Blasley, W. Douglas Durant  
Richard B. Padgett, Chas. P. Davison, Joe Dyess  
John L. Baggett, Ray Brunton, and M. Burns  
Jay B. McGrew, Orris C. Hall and George D. Humphries  
who compose the Grand jury for this term, and  
it appearing to this Court that the Grand jury is  
now complete and is composed of the said  
eighteen named jurors, the Court appointed  
George D. Humphries as foreman of the Grand jury  
and administered to him the oath as set forth  
in section 7284 of the Criminal Code of Alabama  
while the oath set forth in section 7285 was  
only administered to the other Grand jurors  
Adam H. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff  
in attendance to the Grand jury thus organized  
who being duly charged in reference to the  
business to be transacted by them  
retired to the Grand jury room.
