And Grand Jury further Charge that before the finding of this indictment Lamb Robinson Alias Lamb Robinson, having entered into the dwelling house or on the premises of Archie Slaughter and

Dupree Slaughter, failed or refused without legal cause or good excuse to immediately leave upon being ordered or requested to do so by Archer W. Slaughter and Dupree Slaughter or the person in possession his agent or representative,
 Against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.

It is therefore considered that the judgment of the Circuit Court be and is corrected, and the Appellant here sentenced to one hundred and seven (107) days hard labor in place of two (200) days to pay the costs of said prosecution, and the judgment of said Circuit Court as herein corrected, is affirmed without costs.
