You will therefore, by serving a Copy hereof, notify the said Charles Williams, D. P. Slaughter T. L. Ferguson that the said Judgment will be made Absolute against them At the next term of said Court, unless they then appear and show Cause Against ^{the} same.

Organization Of Court And Grand Jury Fall Term 1910.

Be it remembered that at a regular Term Of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County Alabama held at the Court House of said County, on the fourth Monday of October A D 1910. the same being the 24th day of said month, His Honor Samuel B. Brown Judge presiding and also were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said County, previous to the adjournment of the last term of this Court, to wit on the 7th day of April A D 1910, the Judge of this Court drew from the Jury box, in open Court fifty names on each of which was a name to supply the Grand Jury for this term and said names for the first week, and the names of the persons drawn are; Jesse E. Nelson, John W. Bishop, Noah Wilcox, Leck H. Byars, Sam Martin, George W. Miller, James T. Bradley, James A. Stapleton, Dan M. Farrow, George H. Ward, Chas. Y. Wilson, D. Richard Catlett, Henry Gibson, John B. Ship, Wm. H. Chandler, Dan W. Stewart, Sam One, Arthur Nixon, James W. Hammett, Pelmon Lambart, J. Asme Batson, Joe Robinson, Paul Wolf, W. Douglas Durant, Randolph A. L. Luman, Joseph B. Vaughan, James Holton, Bradley, John Pittman, Wm. G. Bishop, Cleveland Felt, Wm. L. Barnett, Roscoe Clippie, John W. Darden, Frank I. Redmond, Chas. T. Phillip, John W. Carnes, Robert L. Guilford, Harrison T. Rowley, John W. Baggett, Joe Dyess, Chas. F. Harrison, Richard B. Padgett, J. L. Phillips, H. Lee Perry, Allen R. Grimes, Chas. O. Hanson, G. Ed. Burgett, Jay B. Mc. Grew and the Judge placed them in an envelope sealed same, and on the 5th day of October 1910 delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire facias containing the names of the persons drawn the day they are to appear, their occupation and the place of business and residence and now comes Thomas A. Boothe, Sheriff of said

County and return into Court his venire facias served upon all of said Jurors, except Noah Sisco, H Lee Perry, E Ed Burkett, and Leslie H Rogers, all of whom answered to their names except James R. Hatcher, John R. Shipp, Sam Evans, Arthur Nixon, and it appearing to the Court that said persons have a good and sufficient excuse for their non attendance at this term of the Court it is ordered that they be and are excused, and the following of said persons so drawn and summoned viz: Henry Gerson, Jesse Ration, John R. Hatcher, Wm. R. Barrette, Roscoe Clippie, appeared and in open Court submitted reasons why they should not serve as Jurors it is ordered that they be and are hereby excused. And now after hearing excuses claims of exemptions and disqualifications, and passing upon the same it appears to the Court that there are not enough qualified Jurors in attendance upon the Court to form the Juries required. The Judge of the Court drew from the Jury box the names of the following Jurors to wit: George W. Humphries, E. Alonzo Higgins, Carlhus L. Erwin, Herbert Kellecrease, John Schumaker, Pete H. Jones, John Whiller, James W. Thompson, John J. Cuffee, Benjamin R. Britt, Arrie L. Hall, Wm. M. Burns, James L. Brown, Morgan Nixon, Wm. P. Matthews, Will Cromartie, Willard W. Olney, Jay P. Mix who were then within or reside within five miles of the Court house, to complete the Juries, then required the Sheriff forthwith to summon such Jurors to attend Court instantly. And now on this the 24th of October 1900 the Judge presiding in open Court required to be called all the persons in attendance upon the Court named in the venire and after hearing their excuses claims of exemptions and disqualifications, and passing upon the same, caused to be placed in a hat the cards containing the names of all the persons present who were not excused by the Court, as exempt or disqualified and the Judge first drew therefrom Eighteen of said cards containing the following names, Jay P. Mix, Will J. Cromartie, Chas. O'Hanlon, Allen L. Givins

Christopher Columbus Rodgers, Robert L Fulford, John L Phillip, James Estlin Brasley, W Douglas Durant, Richard B Padgett, Chas F Davison, Joe Dyess, John W Baggett, Ray Brewton, Wm M Burns, Jay B McLeod, Arvie C Hall, and George W Humphries, who compose the Grand Jury for this term, and it appearing to this Court that the Grand Jury is now complete and is Organized Composed of the eight lighted Jurors, the Court Affiliated George W Humphries as Foreman of the Grand Jury, and Administered to him the Oath as set forth in section 7284 of the Criminal Code of Alabama while the Oath set forth in section 7285 was duly Administered to the other Grand Jurors, and Mr H Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury, thus organized who being charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury Room

And the Grand Jury do further Charge that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th 1909 Felix Beiser sold, offered for sale, kept for sale, or other unlawful disposition, or otherwise disposed of spirituous liquors or malt liquors, contrary to Law, and said Grand Jury further Charge that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th 1909 Felix Beiser maintained an unlawful drinking place contrary to ~~the~~ Statute in such case made and provided

And the Grand Jury further Charge that before the finding of this indictment And since Aug 9th 1909 Felix Beiser Carried on the business of a retail dealer in Liquor, or of a retail deal in malt liquor against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
