Be it remembered that at a regular Term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County Alabama, held at the said Court house of said County, on the further Monday of October AD 1910, the same being the 27th day of said month, His Honor Samuel B. Brown, Judge presiding and also were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said County. Previous to the adjournment of the last term of this Court, to wit: on the 7th day of April AD 1910, the Judge of this Court drew from the jury box, in open Court fifty cards on each of which was a name to supply the Grand Jury for this Term and called names for the first week, and the names of the persons drawn are: Jesse E. Wilson, John W. Bishop, Wash. Niccox, Leslie H. Bryson, Sam. Martin, George W. Wicks, James T. Bradley, James C. Shepherd, Dan McFarren, George H. Ward, Chas. G. Wilson, D. Richard Cabell, Henry Gibson, John B. Shipph, Wm. H. Chandler, Dan W. Stewart, Sam. Arne, Arthur Nixon, James B. Hammett, Freeman Lambert, Jas. E. Batson, Joe E. Johnson, Paul R. Relf, W. Douglas Durant, Randolph M. Swan, Joseph B. Vaughn, James Hutton Bursley, John Pittman, Wm. E. Bishop, Cleveland Fiel, Wm. L. Barnett, Roscoe Clague, John W. Darden, Frank P. Redmond, Chas. T. Phillips, John W. Carnes, Robert L. Guilford, Harrison S. Townley, John W. Baggett, Joe Dyess, Chas. F. Davison, Richard B. Padgett, James L. Phillips, H. Lee Perry, Allen E. Binger.

Charles Hanson, G. Ed Burkett, J. B. McGraw, and the
 Judge placed them in an envelope sealed same,
 and on the 5th day of October 1910, delivered them
 to the Clerk of the Court, who forthwith issued to the
 Sheriff a Venue facias containing the names of
 persons drawn the day they are to appear, their
 Occupation, and the place of business and residence.
 And now comes Pass A. Booth, Sheriff of said County
 and returns into Court his Venue facias served upon
 all of said jurors, except Noah Silcox, H. Lee Perry,
 G. Ed Burkett and Leslie H. Bynars, all of whom answered
 to their names except James C. Chapman, John B. Shipp,
 Sam Evans, Arthur Nixon. And it appearing to the
 Court that said persons have a good and sufficient
 for their own attendance, at this term of the Court
 it is ordered that they be and are hereby excused, and the
 following of said persons so drawn and summoned viz:
 Henry Ripron, J. Asa Batson, John Pittman Jr, W. L. Barnett
 Rosea Rlyba, appeared and in open Court submitted
 reasons why they should not serve as jurors, it is
 ordered that they be and are hereby excused.
 And now after hearing excuses, claims of exemptions
 and disqualifications and passing upon the same
 it appears to the Court that there are not enough
 qualified jurors in attendance upon the Court to
 form the jury required the Judge of the Court
 drew from the jury box the names of the following
 jurors viz: George W. Humphries, E. Aloya Huggins,
 Carthus Irwin, Rupert Kieckhefer, John Schumaker,
 Pete H. Jones, John W. Miller, James M. Thompson, John F. Campbell,
 Benjamin C. Britt, Arrie C. Hall, Wm M. Burns, James Brown
 Morgan Nixon, Wm P. Matthews, Will Cronanier, Willard W. Olney,
 J. P. Mit, who were then within or reside within
 five miles of the Court House to constitute all jurors.
 Then required the Sheriff forthwith to summon such
 jurors to attend Court instantler. And now on this
 the 24th day of October 1910, the Judge presiding in
 open Court, required all the persons in attendance
 upon the Court named in the Venue to be called and
 after hearing excuses claims of exemptions and

disqualifications, and having upon the same caused to be placed in a hat the cards containing the names of all the persons present, who were not excused by the Court, or exempt or disqualified. And the Judge first drew therefrom eighteen of said cards containing the following names, Jay D. Mix, Will J. Cronan, Elias P. Hanson, Allen L. Grimes, Christopher Columbus Rodgers, Robert L. Guilford, Julius L. Phillips, James Hester Peasley, W. Douglas Duant, Richard B. Padgett, Chas. F. Davison, Joe Dyers, John W. Baggett, Ray Brewster, Wm. M. Burns, Jay B. M. Gress, Orville Hall, and George W. Humphries, who compose the Grand Jury for this term. And it appearing to this Court that the Grand Jury is now complete and is composed of the said eighteen named Jurors. The Court appointed George W. Humphries as Foreman of the Grand Jury, and administered to him the Oath as set forth in Sec 7284 of the Criminal Code of Alabama. While the Oath set forth in Sec 7285 was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, and M. S. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury, thus organized, who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury Room.
