conviction has appealed to the Circuit Court of
Baldwin County, Alabama, during June 1911.

Now, therefore, if said Sid Berry, shall be and appear at the said Circuit Court at the next Spring Term thereof and from Term to Term until he is legally discharged, and shall pay all costs and fines imposed upon him, then this obligation is to be null and void; otherwise to be and remain in full force and effect and we do hereby waive our right to all exceptions under the Constitution and Laws of Alabama against the enforcement of this obligation.

Be it remembered that at a regular Term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, held at the said Court House of said County, on the fourth Monday of October 1910, the same being the 24th day of said month, His Honor Samuel Browne Judge presiding and also were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said County. Previous to the adjournment of the last Term of this Court, to wit: on the 7th day of April 1910 the Judge of this Court drew from the Jury box in open Court fifty cards on each of which was a name to supply the Grand Jury for this Term and Patel jurors for the first week, and the names of the persons drawn are: Jesse C. Nelson, John M. Bishop, Noah Hilcox, Leslie H. Bryan, Sam Martin, George B. Miller, James M. Bradley, James R. Waples, Dan M. Farnon, George H. Wood, Chas. G. Wilson, D. Richard R. Smith, Sherry Gifford, John B. Shipp, Wm. H. Cleander, Wm. H. Thiergart, Sam Arne Arthur Nixon, James B. F. Dan, Niceman Lambert, J. Arce Batson, Joe B. Johnson, Paul Rolfe, W. Douglas Durant, Randolph, Lee Gowan, Joseph B. Vaughan, James Hottel, Bradley, John Pittman, Wm. G. Bishop, Cleveland Free, Wm. L. Bernette

Roscoe Clippie, John W Darden, Frank P Redmond, Chas
 J Phillip, John W Carver, Robert L Fulford, Harrison A Goughy
 John W Baggett, Joe Dyer, Chas F. Davison, Richard B
 Padgett, Jiles L Phillip, H Lee Perry, Allen R Grimes
 Chas P Hanson, & Ed Burgett, Jay B M^c Green, And
 the Judge placed them in an envelope sealed
 same, and on the 6th day of October 1910,
 delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who
 forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire facias con-
 taining the names of the persons drawn the day
 they are to appear, their Occupation and the
 place of business and residence. And now comes
 Thos B Booth, Sheriff of said County and returns
 into Court his venire facias served upon all of
 said jurors, Except Noah Sillcox, H Lee Perry, & Ed
 Burgett, And Leslie H Byars, all of whom answered
 to their names except James C Stapleton, John B Shipf
 Sam Crane, Arthur Nixon, And it appearing to the
 Court that said persons have a good and sufficient
 excuse for their non attendance, At this time
 of the Court it is ordered that they be and are
 excused, And the following of said persons so
 drawn and summoned viz; Henry Gibson, J Aslee Bolton
 John Pittman Jr, Wm L Barnett, Roscoe Clippie, appeared
 and in open Court submitted reasons why they
 should not serve as jurors it is ordered they be
 and are excused, And now after hearing excuses,
 claims of exemptions and disqualifications and
 passing upon the same it appears to the Court
 that there are not enough qualified jurors in
 attendance upon the Court to form the jury
 required the Judge of the Court drew from the
 jury box the names of the following jurors viz;
 George Humphries, & Abner Huggins, Carter Lewis,
 Herbert Kell Crace, John Schumaker, Peter H Jones,
 John R Miller, James M Thompson, John J Campbell,
 Benjamin L Britt, Arrie C Hall, Wm M Burns, James
 L Brown, Morgan Nixon, Wm Matthews, Will Cromartie
 Willard & Alney J. Parix who were then within or
 reside within five miles of the Court house.

To Complete All Jurors, then required the Sheriff forthwith to summon such Jurors, to attend Court instant, And now on this the 24th day of October 1910, the Judge presiding in Open Court, required All the persons in attendance upon the Court named in the Service to be called. And after hearing & answering claims of exemptions and disqualifications, And passing upon the same named to be placed in a hat the Cards containing the names of all the persons present, who were not excused by the Court, or exempt or disqualified And the Judge first drew therefrom eighteen of said Cards containing the following names, Jay P. Mix, Will. F. Cromartie, Chas. P. Hanson, Allen C. Grimes, Christopher Columbus Rodgers, Robert L. Fulford, Jiles L. Phillips, James Holton Brasley, H. Douglas Durant, Richard B. Badgett, Chas. F. Davison, Joe Dyess, John W. Baggett, Ray Brewster, Wm. M. Burns, Jay B. McLean, Arrie C. Hall, and George W. Humphreys, who compose the Grand Jury for this term And it appearing to this Court, that the Grand Jury is now complete And is composed of the said eighteen named Jurors the Court appointed George W. Humphreys as Foreman of the Grand Jury, and administered to him the Oath as set forth in Section 7284 of the Criminal Code of Alabama, while the Oath set forth in Section 7285 was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, And M. H. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury, thus organized who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury Room,
