Be it remembered that that a Court was begun and
held for the County of Baldwin State of Alabama
on the eight Monday after the fourth Monday in
Grand Jury March 1911, the same being the 22nd day of May 1911.
His Honor Arthur E. Gamble Judge presiding. Also were
present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of
said County. When the following proceedings were had:
And now comes Otis B. Dickerson, Sheriff of said County
and returns into Court his venire facias served upon

duly and regularly chosen in accordance with Law
to serve as Jurors at the present term of the Circuit

 the Court it is ordered that they be and are excused,
 James P. Stapleton being permanently excused. Thereupon
 After hearing all excuses and claims of exemptions
 and disqualifications, and passing upon all of the
 excuses or claims, the Judge presiding in open Court,
 caused the names of all the jurors in attendance
 upon the Court, who were not excused by the Court,
 to be written upon separate slips or cards and
 placed in a hat or box, thereupon the Judge of the
 Court did in open Court draw from the hat or box
 the names of eighteen jurors who were then duly
 and legally empanelled, sworn and charged by
 the Court as the Grand Jury for this present term
 of the Court, as follows to wit: R. Brad Danully,
 having been appointed and sworn by the Court

Be it remembered that at a

regular term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, held at the said Court House of said County, on the fourth Monday of October A.D. 1910, the same being the 24th day of said month, His Honor Samuel B. Browne, Judge presiding and also were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said County, previous to the adjournment of the last term of this Court to wit: on the 7th day of April A.D. 1910, the Judge of this Court drew from the jury box, in open Court fifty cards on each of which was a name to supply the Grand Jury for this term and petit jurors for the first week; and the names of the persons drawn are; Jesse E. Nelson, John M. Bishop, W. C. Sisco, Lestie H. Byars, Sam Martin, George W. Miller, James T. Bradley, James R. Stapleton, Dan M. Farrow, George B. Ward, Chas. G. Wilson, D. Richard Catlett, Henry Simpson, John B. Shipb, Wm. W. Chandler, Dan W. Stewart, Sam Arme, Arthur Nixon, James B. Hammett, Tillman Lambert, J. C. Patton, Joe B. Johnson, Paul Relf, W. Douglas Durant, Randolph M. E. Gowan, Joseph B. Vaughn, James Hutton Brasley, John Pittman Jr., Wm. G. Bishop, Cleveland Felt, Wm. A. Barnett, Roscoe Clizbie, John W. Darden, Frank P. Edmund, Chas. T. Phillips, John W. Carver, Robert L. Fairford, Harrison S. Rawley, John W. Baggett, Joe Dyess, Chas. F. Davison, Richard B. Padgett, J. L. Phillips, H. Lee Perry, Allen R. Grimes, Chas. P. Hansen, G. Ed. Burgett, Jay B. M. Gens, and the Judge placed them in an envelope sealed same, and on the 5th day of October 1910 delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire facias.

Containing the names of the persons drawn the
 day they are to appear, their occupation, and
 the place of business and residence.
 And now comes Thos E Booth, Sheriff of said County
 and returns into Court his venire facias served
 upon all of said jurors except, Noble Hixox, W Lee Perry
 G. Ed Burget, and Leslie H Byars, all of whom
 answered to their names except, James E Stapleton,
 John B Shiph, Sam Crane, Arthur Nixon, and it appearing
 to the Court that said persons have a good and sufficient
 excuse for their non attendance, At this time of the
 Court, it is ordered that they be and are excused,
 And the following of said persons so drawn and
 summoned, viz: Henry Gibson, J. Allen Watson, John
 and Grand Pictman Jr, Wm L Barnett, Roscoe Rhybie, appeared and
 in open Court, and submitted reasons why they should
 not serve as Jurors, it is ordered that they be and
 are hereby excused, And now after hearing excuses,
 claims of exemptions and disqualifications, and passing
 upon the same it appears to the Court that there
 are not enough qualified Jurors in attendance
 upon the Court to form the Juries required, the
 Judge of the Court drew from the Jury box the names
 of the following Jurors viz: George W Humphries,
 E George Higgins, Carters Irwin, Harbut Keenace
 John Chumaker, Peter H Jones, John W Miller, James
 M Thompson, John J Campbell, Benjamin R Britt
 Arvie Le Hall, Wm M Burns, James L Brown,
 Morgan Nixon, Wm P Matthews, Will Cromarty, Michael
 W Almy, Jay P Mix, who were then within or
 reside within five miles of the Court House,
 to complete the Juries, then required, the Sheriff
 forthwith to summon such Jurors to attend Court
 instantaneously, And now on this 24th of October 1910,
 the Judge presiding in open Court, required all the
 Jurors in attendance upon the Court named in
 the venire to be called and after hearing excuses
 claims of exemptions and disqualifications and
 passing upon the same, caused to be placed in
 in a hat the cards containing the names of all

the persons present, who were not excused by the Court, as exempt or disqualified and the Judge first drew therefrom eighteen of said order containing the following names, Jay P. Mix, W. H. & Cromartie, Char. P. Hanson, Allen C. Brimmer, Christopher Columbus Rodgers, Robert L. Fulford, Giles L. Phillips, James Holton Beasley, W. Douglas Durant, Richard B. Padgett, Char. F. Davison, Joe Dyess, John W. Baggett, Ray Brewton, Wm. M. Burns, Jay B. M. Brew, Arrie C. Hall, and George W. Humphries, who composed the Grand Jury for this term. And it appearing to this Court, that the Grand Jury is now complete and is composed of the said eighteen named jurors, the Court appointed George W. Humphries as foreman of the Grand Jury and administered to him the oath as set forth in section 7284 of the Criminal Code of Alabama, while the oath set forth in section 7285 - was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, and M. H. McKissick was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury, thus organized, who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury room.
