of said County and returns into Court his

 in Open Court. Submitted reasons why they should
 not serve as Jurors at the present term of this Court,
 And asked the Court to excuse them, which
 upon consideration it is ordered by the Court that
 they be and are excused. James C Stapleton being
 permanently excused. Thereupon after hearing all
 excuses And claims of exemptions And disqualifications
 And passing upon all of the excuses Or claims
 the Judge presiding in Open Court, caused the
 names of all the Jurors in Attendance upon the
 Court, who were not excused by the Court to be
 written upon separate slips Or cards, And placed in
 a hat Or box, And thereupon the Judge of the Court
 did in Open Court draw from the hat Or box
 the names of eighteen Jurors, who were then
 duly And legally empaneled, sworn And charged
 by the Court as the Grand Jury, for the present
 term of the Court. As follows to wit: C Brad Damsley
 having been appointed And sworn by the Court as
 Foreman of said Grand Jury; Joseph Owens,
 Thomas W. Connel, G Randolph Sawyer, James A Phelps,
 J Wiley Biggs, Leopidas W Kendrick, George W Rockwell
 B Labon Cain, Willard Gabel, Wm Wallace Kierman,
 Lewis C Howard, Hilary Ward, Oscar Wynn, Gerald B
 Hall Jr., Henry Gipson, A Dack Catlett, And Cicero Nelson,
 And the Grand Jury then retired under the charge of
 W. M. Fuller, who had been duly appointed And sworn
 by the Court, as Bailiff to said Grand Jury.
