regular Term of the Circuit Court begun and

held At the said Court House of said County,

on the fourth Monday of October 1910. The same

being the 24th day of October 1910 His Honor

present the Clerk of said Court And the Sheriff

of said County. Previous to the adjournment of the

last term of this Court. To wit; on the 7th day of

April. A.D. 1910, the Judge of this Court drew from the

jury box in open Court fifty cards each of which

was a name to supply the Grand Jury for this term

And Petit Jurors for the first term. And the names

 place of business and residence. And now comes
 Thor A Booth, Sheriff of said County, and returns
 into Court his venire facias served upon all
 of said Jurors, except Wash Sisco, H Lee Perry,
 E. Ed Burgett, Leslie H Bryan, all of whom answered
 to their names except James C Stapleton, John B Schipp,
 Sam Crane, Arthur Nixon, And it appearing to the Court
 that said persons have a good and sufficient excuse
 for their non attendance, At this time of the Court
 it is ordered that they be and are excused, And
 the following of said persons so drawn and summoned
 viz: Henry Gipson, J Assee Batson, John Pittman Jr,
 W^m L Barnette, Roscoe Clizbie, appeared and in open
 Court submitted reasons why they should not serve
 as Jurors it is ordered that they be and are excused,
 And now after hearing excuses, claims of exemptions
 and disqualifications and passing upon the same
 it appears to the Court that there are not enough
 qualified Jurors in attendance upon the Court
 to form the jury required the Judge of the Court
 drew from the jury box the names of the following
 Jurors viz: George W Humphries, & Abner Huggins,

Carthar Irwin, Herbert L. Kieckhefer, John Schumaker, Pete Jones, John R. Miller, James M. Thompson, John J. Campbell, Benjamin R. Britt, Arrie C. Hall, Wm. M. Burns, James L. Brown, Morgan Nixon, Wm. P. Matthews, Will Promettie, Willard K. Coney, Jay P. Dix, who were then within or reside within five miles of the Court House. To complete all Jurors required the Sheriff forthwith to summon such Jurors to attend Court instantly. And now on this the 24th day of October 1906, the Judge presiding in Open Court, required all the persons in attendance upon the Court named in the venire to be called and after hearing excuses claims of exemptions and disqualifications and passing upon the same, caused to be placed in a hat ~~the cards~~ containing the names of all the persons present, who were not excused by the Court, as exempt or disqualified and the Judge first drew therefrom eighteen of said cards containing the following names, Jay P. Dix Will J. Promettie, Chas. P. Hanson, Allen C. Grimes, Christopher Columbus Rodgers, Robert L. Telford, Jiles L. Phillips, James Hutton Bursley, W. Douglas Dewart, Richard B. Padgett Chas. F. Davison, Joe Dyess, John W. Baggett, Ray Brewton, Wm. M. Burns, Jay B. M. Grew, Arrie C. Hall, and George W. Humphries, who composed the Grand Jury for this term, and it appearing to the Court, that the Grand Jury is now complete and is composed of the said eighteen named Jurors. The Court appointed George W. Humphries, as Foreman of the Grand Jury, and administered to him the oath as set forth in Section 2284, of the Criminal Code of Oregon, while the oath set forth in Section 2285 was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, and M. H. Watkins was sworn in as Sheriff in attendance to the Grand Jury, thus organized, who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury room.

2. And the said Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this indictment, and since August 26th 1909, Jim Hayes sold, offered for sale, kept for sale or otherwise disposed of prohibited liquors and beverages.

3 And the Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th 1909, Jim Hayes sold, offered for sale, or otherwise disposed of spirituous, vinous, or malt liquors contrary to law.

4 And the Grand Jury further charge that, before the finding of this indictment, and since August 9th, 1909, Jim Hayes, maintained an unlawful drinking place, contrary to the statutes in such case made and provided.

5. And the Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th, 1909, Jim Hayes, carried on the business of a retail dealer in liquors, or of a retail dealer in malt liquors.
