Grand Jury (The State of Alabama)
Baldwin County) Circuit Court Fall Term 1910
Be it remembered that a regular term of the
Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, held
at the Court House of said County, on the 24th
Monday of October A.D. 1911, the same being the
24th day of the month, His Honor Samuel
B. Brumby, Judge Presiding, and also were
present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff
of said County. Previous to the adjournment
of the last term of this Court, to wit: on the 7th
day of April, A.D. 1910, the Judge of this Court
drew from the jury box, in open Court, fifty
Cards on each of which was a name to
supply the Grand Jury for this term and
Petit Jurors for the second week. And the

Chas V. Davison, Richard B. Padgett, Siles L. Phillips,

 in an envelope, sealed same and on the 5th day
 of October 1910 delivered them to the Clerk of the Court;
 who forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire facias
 containing the names of the persons drawn, the
 day they are to appear, their occupation and the
 place of business and residence, and now comes
 Thos A. Booth, Sheriff of Baldwin County and
 returns into Court his venire facias, served upon
 all of said jurors, except Noah Silcox, H. Lee
 Perry, G. Ed. Burgett and Leslie H. Bryans, all
 of whom answered to their names except James
 McStapleton, John B. Shipps, Sam. Crane, and
 Arthur Woxon, and it appearing to the Court
 that said persons have a good and suffici-
 ent excuse for their non attendance, at this term
 of the Court it is ordered that they be and are
 excused, and the following of said persons so
 drawn and summoned viz; Henry Hipson
 J. Assee Patson, John Pittman Jr, Dan Barnette,
 Rosco Klibel, appeared and in open Court
 submitted reasons why they should not serve
 as jurors, it is ordered that they be and are
 hereby excused, and now after hearing ex-
 cused claims of exemptions and disqualifi-
 cations and passing upon the same it appe-
 ars to the Court that there are not enough qual-
 -ified jurors in attendance upon the Court
 to form the juries required, the Judge of the
 Court drew from the jury box the names of
 the following jurors viz; George W. Humphries
 O. Mayo Higgins, Arthur Davis, Herbert
 Stillcrease, John H. Schumaker, Pete H. Jones,
 John W. Miller, James M. Thompson, John B.
 Campbell, Benjamin C. Britt, Orris C. Hall,
 Amos Burns, James L. Brown, Morgan Nixon
 Am P. Matthews, Will J. Romartie, William Cherry,
 J. P. Mix, who were then within, or resided within

five miles of the Court House to complete all juries
 when required the Sheriff forthwith to summon
 such jurors to attend Court instant. And now comes
 Grand Jury on this the 24th day of October 1910. The Judge
 presiding in open Court required to be called all
 the persons in attendance upon the Court named in
 the venire and after hearing excuses claims of ex-
 emptions and disqualifications and passing
 upon the same caused to be placed in a hat
 the cards containing the names of all the persons
 present, who were not excused by the Court, or ex-
 empt or disqualified and the Judge first drew
 therefrom eighteen of said cards containing
 the following names: Ray M. Dix, David L. Romartie,
 Albas P. Harrison, Allen C. Krinner, Christopher
 Columbus Rodgers, Robert L. Bulford, Biles L.
 Phillips, James Holton Brasley, W. Douglas Gur-
 ant, Richard B. Padgett, Chas. P. Davison, Joe Dyess,
 John W. Baggett, Ray Brewster, Ann M. Burns,
 Ray B. McPherson, Opie C. Hall, and George W.
 Humphries, who composed the Grand Jury
 for this term, and it now appearing to this
 Court that the Grand Jury is now complete, and
 is composed of the said eighteen named jurors
 the Court appointed George W. Humphries as
 foreman of the Grand Jury, and admin-
 istered to him the oath as set forth in section
 7284, of the Criminal Code of Alabama, while
 the oath set forth in section 7285 was duly
 administered to the other Grand Jurors. And
 M. A. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in
 attendance to the Grand Jury this organ-
 ized who being duly charged in refer-
 ence to the business to be transacted
 then retired to the Grand Jury Room
