W Douglas Durant. Randolph Mc Goban. Joseph Vaughan. James Holtum Beasley. John Pittman John H Bishop Cleveland Hill. Perry L Barnett. Roscoe Clibbe. John W Gorden. Frank P Redmond. Chas P Phillips. John W Carver. Robert L Pheasant. Harrison Downley. John W Baggett. Joe Lyess. Chas P Davison. Richard B Padgett. J Lee L Phillips. H Lee Perry. Allen C Kimes. Chas P Hanson. G Ed Burgett. Jay B McGraw. and the Judge placed them in an envelope, sealed same up and on the 5th day of October 1918 delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire facias containing the names of the persons drawn the day they are to appear their occupation and the place of business and residence and now comes Thos A Booth, Sheriff of said County and returns into Court his venire facias, served upon all of said jurors except Noah Silcox. H Lee Perry. G Ed Burgett and Leslie H Briers, all of whom answered to their names except: James C Stapleton. John B Shipp. Sam Krage. and Arthur Nixon and it appearing to the Court that said persons have a good and sufficient excuse for nonattendance, at this term of the Court it is ordered that they be and are excused, and the following of said persons so drawn and summoned viz: Henry Ripson. Jesse Batson. John Pittman Jr. Sam L Baggett. Roscoe Clibbe. appeared and in open Court

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submitted reasons why they should not serve as jurors it is ordered that they be and are hereby excused. And now after hearing excuses, claims of exemptions and disqualifications and passing upon the same it appears to the Court that there are not enough qualified jurors in attendance upon the Court to form the jurries required. The Judge of the Court drew from the jury box the names of the following jurors viz; George A. Humphries. Elmore Higgins, Luther Brown, Herbert Stillcrease, John H. Schumaker, Pete H. Jones, John W. Miller, James M. Thompson, John Campbell, Benjamin C. Britt, Eric C. Hall, John Burns, James L. Brown, Morgan Nixon, Dan Matthews, Will J. Cromartie, Willard D. Orley, J. P. Mix, who were then within or resided within five miles of the Court House to complete all jurries then required the Sheriff forthwith to summon such jurors to attend Court instantly and now on this 24th day of October 1910, the Judge presiding in open Court required to be called all the persons in attendance upon the Court named in the verise and after hearing excuses claims of exemptions and disqualifications and passing upon the same caused to be placed in a hat the Cards containing the names of all the persons present; who were not excused by the Court or exempt or disqualified. And the Judge first drew there from eighteen of said Cards containing the following names: Jay P. Mix, Will J. Cromartie, Chas. Harrison, Allen C. Himes, Christopher Columbus Rogers, Robert L. Purford, Giles L. Phillips, James Holton, Beasley, Daseglass Durant, Richard B. Padgett, W. O. Davison, Joe Gress, John W. Baggett, W. E. Brewster, Dan W. Burns, Jay B. H. Hume, Eric C. Hall and George Humphries, who compose the Grand Jury for this term. It now appearing to this Court that the jury is now complete and is composed

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of the said eighteen named jurors the Court appointed George W. Humphries as foreman of the Grand jury, and administered to him the oath as set forth in section 7284, of their Criminal Code of Alabama. While the oath set forth in section 7285 was duly administered to the other Grand jurors. Adam H. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand jury thus organized who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted then retired to the Grand Jury Room.
