Circuit Court Fall Term 1910

Be it remembered that at the a regular term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County Alabama held at the said Court House of said County, on the fourth Monday of October AD 1910 the same being the 24th day of said month. His Honor Samuel B Brown Judge presiding and also were present the Clerk of said Court, and the Sheriff of said County. Previous to the adjournment of the last term of this Court, to wit: on the 7th day of April AD 1910. the Judge of this Court drew from the jury box, in open Court fifty cards on each of which was a name to supply the Grand Jury for this term and Petit Jurors for the first week, and the names of the persons drawn are: Jesse E Wilson, John M Bishop, Frank Silcox, Leslie H Ryars, Sam Martin, George L Miller, James Bradley, James C Stapleton, Sam McFarren, George H Hard, Chas E Wilson, D Richard Catrett, Henry Ripson, John B Shipp, Sam H Chandler, Sam D Stewart, Sam Anne Arthur Nixon James R Hammett, Tillman Lanobul, Jesse Bateon, Joe B Johnson, Paul Rolfe, W Douglas Durant, Randolph Mc Bowman, Joseph B Vanhook, James Holton Brasley, John Pittman Jr, Sam H Bishop, Cleveland Bell, Sam L Barnett, Rose Clibbey, John D Durden, Frank P Redmond, Chas Phillips, John W Carver, Robert Helford, Harrison S Townley, John W Baggett, Joe Dyer, Chas M Davison, Richard Baggett, Giles Phillips, Lee Perry, Allen C Brines, Chas P Hanson, E Ed Burgett, Jay B McNew and the Judge placed them in an envelope sealed same, and on the 5th day of October 1910 delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire facias containing the names of the persons drawn the day they are to appear, their occupation, and the place of business and residence, and now comes Thos A Booth, Sheriff of said County

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And returns into Court his venerables served upon all of said jurors, except Noah Silcox, H. Lee Perry, G. Ed Bengt, and Leslie H. Bryans, all of whom answered, to their names except James C. Stapleton, John B. Shipf, Sam. Crane, Arthur Nixon, and if appearing to the Court that said persons have a good and sufficient excuse for their nonattendance, at this term of the Court, it is ordered that they be and are excused, and the following of said persons so drawn and summoned viz; Henry Simpson & Asner Batson, John Pittman, and L. Barnette Roscoe Elizbie, appeared and in open Court submitted reasons reasons why they should not serve as jurors, it is ordered that they be and are hereby excused, and now after hearing excuses, claims of exemptions and disqualification and passing upon the same it appears to the Court that there are not enough qualified jurors in attendance upon the Court to form the jurys required the Judge of the Court drew from the jury box the names of the following jurors viz; George B. Humphries, Ellonga Huggins, Carthus Quinn, Herbert Stillcreek, John Schumaker, Pete H. Jones, John Miller, James M. Thompson, John B. Campbell, Benjamin Britt, Orrin C. Hall, Wm M. Burns, James L. Brown, Morgan Nixon, and Matthews, Will Cronartie, Willard Charles, & P. O'rix, who were then within or resided within five miles of the Court House, to complete all jurors, then required the Sheriff forthwith to summon and such jurors to attend Court instantly, and now on this the 24th day of October 1910, the Judge presiding in open Court, required all the persons in attendance upon the Court named in the venire to be called and after hearing excuses claims of exemption and disqualification, and passing upon the same, caused to be placed in a box the names containing the

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names of all the persons present; who were not excused by the Court; or exempt or disqualified and the Judge first drew therefrom eighteen of said cards containing the following names Jay P. Nix, Will J. Comartie, Chas. P. Slanson, Allen C. Grimes, Christopher Columbus Rogers, Robert L. Pelford, Giles L. Phillips, James Holton Beasley, W. Douglas Du-rant, Richard Baggett, Chas. D. Larrison, Joe D. Gess, John D. Baggett, Ray Brewster, E. M. Burns, Jay B. McKee, Orris C. Hall, and George W. Humphries, who com-pose the Grand Jury for this term, and it appearing to this Court that the Grand Jury is now complete and is composed of the said eighteen named jurors the Court appointed George W. Humphries as foreman of the Grand Jury and administered to him the oath as set forth in section 7284 of the Criminal Code of Alabama, while the oath set forth in section 7285 was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, and W. H. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury, thus organized, who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury Room.

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John Langham. since August-9th 1909 sold, offered for sale, kept-for sale, or other unlawful disposition or otherwise disposed of prohibited liquors or beverages.

4 And the Grand Jury further Charge that before the finding of this Indictment and after August-9th 1909 John Langham sold, kept-for sale, or other unlawful disposition or otherwise disposed of spirituous, vinous, or malt-Liquors, Contrary to law

5- And the Grand Jury further Charge that before the finding of this Indictment and after Aug 25th 1909 John Langham sold, kept-for sale, or other unlawful disposition, or otherwise disposed of prohibited Liquors Contrary to law against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
