

The State vs. George Baldwin V.P.L. continued

said Court. And the Sheriff of said County, Previous to the adjournment of the last term of this Court, to wit: on the 7th day of April A.D. 1910: the Judge of this Court drew from the Jury box, in open Court, fifty cards on each of which was a name to supply the Jury for this term, and a Petit Jury for the second week, and the names of the Persons drawn are; Jesse E. Nelson, John M. Bishop, Noah Silcox, Leslie H. Bryars, Sam Martin, George W. Miller, James P. Bradley, James C. Stapleton, Sam McFarren, George H. Ward, Chas. E. Wilson, L. Richard Catlett, Henry Simpson, John B. Shipp, Lem H. Chandler, David Stewart, Sam Leane, Arthur Nixon, James R. Hammett, Tillman Lambert, Jesse Batson, Joe Johnson, Paul Rolfe, W. Douglas Durant, Randolph McLowry, Joseph Lawler, James Holton Deasley, John Pittman Jr., Lem H. Bishop, Cleveland O'Neil, Lem L. Barnette, Roscoe Clibbie, John W. Dunders, Frank P. Redmond, Chas. Phillips, John W. Carver, Robert L. Hulford, Harrison Courley, John W. Baggett, Joe Dyess, Chas. P. Davison, Richard B. Padgett, Wiley L. Phillips, Lee Perry, Allen C. Grimes, Chas. P. Hanson, Geo. Burgett, Ray B. McKnew, and the Judge placed them in an envelope sealed same, and on the 5th day of October 1910, delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire facias, containing the names of the Persons drawn, the day they are to appear, their occupation and the place of business and residence. And now comes Thos. A. Booth, Sheriff of Baldwin County and returns into Court his venire facias, served upon all of said Jurors, except Noah Silcox, Lee Perry, Geo. Burgett, Leslie H. Bryars and all of whom answered to their names, except, James C. Stapleton, John B. Shipp, Sam Leane and Arthur Nixon, and it appearing to the Court, that said persons have a good and sufficient excuse for their non attendance, at this term of the Court, it is ordered that they be and are excused, and the following of said persons so drawn and summoned, viz: Henry Simpson, Jesse Batson, John Pittman Jr., Lem L. Barnette, Roscoe Clibbie, appeared and in open Court submitted

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reasons why they should not serve as jurors, it is ordered that they be and are hereby excused. And now after hearing excuses, claims of exemption and disqualifications and passing upon the same, it appears to the Court that there are not enough qualified jurors in attendance upon the Court to form the jury required. The Judge of the Court drew from the jury box the names of the following jurors viz: George W. Humphries, Edw. Huggins, Leathur Lewis, Herbert Stillcrease, John H. Schumaker, Plett Jones, John W. Miller, James M. Thompson, John D. Campbell, Benjamin C. Britt, Arrie C. Hall, Lynd M. Burns, James L. Brown, Jurgan Nixon, Am. Matthews, Will J. Cronastie, Willard M. Wiley, & P. Mix, who were then within or resided within five miles of the Court House to complete all jurors then required. The Sheriff forthwith to summons such jurors to attend Court instantly. And now on this the 24th day of October 1910 the Judge presiding in open Court required to be called all the persons in attendance upon the Court named in the venire and after hearing excuses, claims of exemption and disqualifications and passing upon the same, caused to be placed in a hat the cards containing the names of all the persons present, who were not excused by the Court, or exempted or disqualified, and the Judge first drew therefrom eighteen of the cards containing the following names, Jay Phix, Will J. Cronastie, Chas. P. Hanson, Allen Ekimes, Christopher Columbus Rodgers, Robert L. Delford, Giles L. Phillips, James Holton Beasley, W. Douglas Durant, Richard B. Padgett, Chas. G. Davison, Joe Dyess, John W. Baggett, Ray Brewton, Lynd M. Burns, Jay B. McNew, Arrie C. Hall and George W. Humphries, who compose the Grand jury for this term, And it now appearing to this Court that the Grand jury is now complete and is composed of the said eighteen named jurors. The Court appoints George W. Humphries as foreman of the Grand jury, and administers to him the oath as set forth in section 7284, of the criminal code of Alabama, while the oath set

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forth in section 7285; was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors. and J. H. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury thus organized who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted, then retired to the Grand Jury Room.

4 And the said Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th 1909 George Baldwin maintained an unlawful drinking place, contrary to the statutes in such case made and provided.

5- And the said Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th 1909 George Baldwin carried on the business of a retail dealer.
