Be it remembered that at a
regular term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin
County, Alabama, held at the said Court
House of said County, on the fourth day
of October A.D. 1910, the same being the 24th
day of said month, His Honor Samuel B
Brown, Judge presiding and also were
present the Clerk of said Court, and the

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Sheriff of said County, Previous to the adjournment of the last term of the Court. to wit: on the 7th day of April A.D. 1910 the Judge of this drew from the Jury box, in open Court fifty cards on each of which was a name to supply the Grand Jury, for this term and Petit Jurors for the first week, and the names of the persons drawn are; Jesse C Nelson, John Bishop, Noah Silcox, Leslie H Bryans, Sam Martin, George Miller, James M Bradley, James C Stapleton, Dan McParren, George Howard, Chas E Wilson, D - Richard Catlett, Henry Kipson, John B Shipp, Am H Chandler, Dan W Stewart, Sam Arne, Arthur Nixon, James R Hammett, Tillman Lambert, Jesse Bates, Joe B Johnson, Paul Rolfe, W Douglas Durant, Randolph McKeown, Joseph B Baugh, James Holton Beasley, John Pittman Jr, Am G Bishop, Cleveland Peck, Am L Barnett, Ross Cliffe, John W Gunders, Frank P Redmond, Chas O Phillips, John W Carver, Robert L Chelford, Harrison S Conrley, John W Baggett, Joe Byess, Chas F Davison, Richard B Padgett, Giles L Phillips, H Lee Perry, Allen C Spence, Chas P Hanson, H Ed Burgett, Gay B McKnew and the Judge placed them in an envelope sealed same, and on the 5th day of October 1910 delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire facias containing the names of the persons drawn, the day they are to appear their occupation, and the place of business and residence, And now comes Thor A Booth Sheriff of said County, and returns into Court his venire facias served upon all of said Jurors, except Noah Silcox, H Lee Perry, H Ed Burgett and Leslie H Bryans, all of whom answered to their names except James C Stapleton, John B Shipp, Sam Crane, Arthur Nixon, and appearing to the Court that said persons have a good and sufficient excuse for their non attendance,

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at this term of the Court it is ordered that they be and are excused. and the following of said persons so drawn and summoned viz; Henry Kipson, J. C. Bateson, John Pitman Jr, Lunt Banette, Roscoe Elgible. appeared and in open Court submitted reasons why they should not serve as jurors, it is ordered that they be and are here by excused, and now after hearing excuses, Claims of exemption and disqualification, and passing upon the same it appears to the Court that there are not enough qualified jurors in attendance upon the Court to form the juries required. the Judge of the Court drew from the jury box the names of the following jurors viz: George D. Humphries, Eltono Huggins, Cathus Dwin, Herbert Kicease, John Schumaker, Pete H. Jones, John D. Miller, James H. Thompson, John Campbell, Benjamin C. Britt, Arrie L. Hall, Ann M. Burns, James L. Brown, Morgan Nixon, Ann Mathews, Will Cronastie, Willard W. Loney, & P. Mix. who were then within or resided within five miles of the Court House, to complete all juries. then required the Sheriff forthwith to summon such jurors to attend Court instantly. And now on this the 24th of October 1916. the Judge presiding in open Court required all the persons in attendance upon the Court named in the venire to be called and after hearing excuses, Claims of exemptions and disqualifications, and passing upon the same caused to be placed in a hat, the Cards containing the names of all the persons present who were not excused by the Court, or exempt or disqualified and the Judge first drew there from, eighteen of said Cards containing the following names, Jay P. Wix, Will J. Cronastie, Chas. D. Hanson, Allen C. Haines, Christopher Columbus Rodgers, Robert D. Welford, Giles L. Phillips, James Holton Beasley, W. Douglas Durant, Richard B. Padgett, Chas. O. Davison, Joe. Geese, John E. Baggett, Ray Brewster, M. Burns,

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Jay McKnew, Archie Hall and George W. Humphries who compose the Grand Jury for this term find it appearing to this Court, that the Grand Jury is now complete and is composed of the said eighteen named jurors, the Court appointed George W. Humphries as Foreman of the Grand Jury and Administered to him the oath as set forth in section 7284 of the Criminal Code of Alabama, while the oath set forth in section 7285 was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, and W. H. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury. thus organized, who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury Room.

1 The Grand Jury of said County Charge that, before the finding of this Indictment, Clem Askew, sold offered for sale, kept for sale or other unlawful disposition, or otherwise disposed of Spirituous, vinous or malt liquors, since August 25th 1909.

2 The Grand Jury of said County further Charge that before the finding, of this Indictment Clem Askew, sold, offered for sale, kept for sale or other unlawful disposition, or otherwise disposed of prohibited liquors and beverages.

3 And said Grand Jury further Charge that before the finding of this Indictment Clem Askew sold, offered for sale, kept for sale or other unlawful disposition, or otherwise disposed of spirituous vinous or malt liquors since August 25th 1909.

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4 The Grand Jury further Charge that before the finding of this Indictment, that since August 25th 1909, Clem Askew maintained an unlawful drinking place contrary to the statute in such case made and provided.

5 And the Grand Jury further Charge that before the finding of this Indictment that Clem Askew while engaged in the business of selling beverage, kept or stored on the premises where said beverage business was conducted prohibited liquors or beverage all of said acts being contrary to law and Against the Peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
