Consideration it is ordered by the Court that they be and are excused. Thereupon after hearing all excuses and claims of exemptions and disqualifications and passing upon all of the excuses or claims the Judge presiding in open Court, caused the names of all the Jurors in attendance upon the Court who were not excused by the Court to be written upon separate slips or cards, and placed in a hat or box, and thereupon the Judge of the Court did in open Court draw from the hat or box the names of eighteen Jurors who were then duly and legally empaneled sworn and charged by the Court as the Grand Jury. for the present term of the Court as follows.
