 delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who  
 forthwith issued to the Sheriff a venire Jacias  
 containing the names of the persons drawn  
 the day they are to appear, their occupations  
 and the place of business & residence, and now  
 comes Thomas A. Booth Sheriff of said County  
 and returns into Court his venire Jacias  
 served upon all of said jurors, except Robt  
 Silcox, Lee Perry, E. Ed Burgett, and Leslie H. Bey-  
 ars, all of whom answered to their names  
 except James C. Stapleton, John B. Shipp, Saml Lane  
 Arthur Nixon. And it appearing to the Court  
 that said persons have a good and suffi-  
 cient excuse for their non attendance, at this  
 term of the Court it is ordered that they be  
 and are excused, and the following of  
 said persons so drawn and summoned by;  
 Henry Gibson, J. Assec Batson, John Pittman Jr.  
 William L. Barnette, Roswell Libbie appeared and  
 in open Court submitted reasons why they  
 should not serve as jurors, it is ordered  
 that they be and are excused. And now  
 after hearing excuses, claims of exemptions  
 and disqualifications, and passing upon

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the same it appears to the Court that there are not enough qualified jurors in attendance upon the Court to form the jury required the Judge of the Court drew from the jury box the names of the following jurors viz: George W. Humphries, Ollie A. Higgins, Cleathus ~~Drum~~, Herbert Kelleese, John Schumaker, Pete H. Jones, John W. Miller, James M. Thompson, John J. Wardwell, Benjamin L. Britt, Orie C. Hall, Rymond Burns, James L. Brown, Morgan Nixon, Sam P. Mathews, Will Lermantie, Willard W. Dwyer, J. P. Mix, who were then within or resided within five miles of the Court House, to complete all juries, then required the Sheriff forthwith to summon such jurors to attend Court instantly, and now on this the 24th of October 1910. The Judge presiding in open Court required all the persons in attendance upon the Court named in the venire to be called and after hearing excuses claims of exemptions and disqualifications, and passing upon the same caused to be placed in a hat the cards containing the names of all the persons present, who were not excused by the Court, or exempt or disqualified. And the Judge first drew there from eighteen of said cards containing the following names. Ray P. Mix, Will Lermantie, Chas W. Hanson, Allen C. Grimes, Christopher Columbus Rodgers, Robert L. Dwyer, Giles L. Phillips, James Holtor & Massey, W. Douglas Stewart, Richard B. Padgett, Chas P. Davison, Joe Dwyer, John W. Baggett, Ray Brewster, Rymond Burns, Gay K. McKen, Orie C. Hall, and George Humphries, who compose the Grand Jury for this term. And it appearing to this Court, that the Grand Jury is now complete and is composed of the said eighteen named jurors, the Court appointed George W. Humphries as foreman of the Grand Jury and administered to him the oath as set forth in Section 7284, of the Criminal Code of

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of Alabama. While the oath set forth in Section 7285 was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, and M. H. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury thus organized, who being duly charged in reference to the Business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury room.
