Organization
of Court
and
Grand Jury

Be it remembered that a Court was begun and held
for the County of Baldwin, State of Alabama,
on the eighth Monday after the fourth Monday in
March 1912, the same being the 20th day of May
1912, His Honor Arthur C. Howble, Judge presiding,
also were present the Clerk of said Court, and the
Sheriff of said County, when the following
proceedings were had:

And His Honor the Sheriff of said County
and returns into Court his venerable as served upon
the following good and lawful men who had
been duly and regularly drawn in accordance
with Law, to serve as jurors at the present term
of the Circuit Court to wit: William Bryant,

of the said jurors summoned, to be called
all of whom answered to their names except William C.
Bryant, Frank P. Raymond, Mel Hazard, Walter L.
Lewis, James H. Wiggins, Charles Lee, John Leavins.

Thomas A. Pruitt, Frank Leavins, Henry Lewis, John A. Young, Amy M. Cwalt, and it appearing to the Court that said persons have good and sufficient excuse for their non-attendance at this term of the Court it is ordered that they be and are excused, William C. Bryant, Frank Leavins, John Leavins, Walter Lewis, James P. Higgins, Henry M. Cwalt, being permanently excused. Gordon B. Phillips, Minnie Thompson, W. Luther Unstall, Ernest McMillan, in open Court submitted reasons why they should not serve as Jurors at the present term of this Court, and asked the Court to excuse them, which upon consideration it is ordered by the Court that they be and are excused. Thereupon after hearing all excuses and claims of exemptions and disqualifications, and passing upon all of the excuses or claims, the Judge presiding in open Court, caused the names of all the Jurors in attendance upon the Court, who were not excused by the Court, to be written upon separate slips or cards, and placed in a hat or box, and thereupon the Judge of the Court did in open Court draw from the hat or box the names of eighteen Jurors who were then duly and legally empanelled, sworn, and charged by the Court as the Grand Jury for the present term of the Court, as follows: Jere Durrell, Chestang having been appointed and sworn by the Court as Foreman of said Grand Jury, James A. Phillips, Andrew Smith, David Donaldson, John Brewster, Joseph H. Mc Gill, A. P. Tilly, Weeks Will Williams, Amy A. Bunnage, Charles C. Collins, John Amathathes, Sam Nelson, Joseph A. Bishop, A. Fuller Calaway, Levi Jackson, William C. Hanson, W. Lasque Hale, William West, and the said Grand Jury then retired under the charge of A. M. Fuller who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand Jury.

road, which said Court had authority to
administer such oath, falsely sworn ~~that~~ ^{that} he

said Jerry Leath being willfully and corruptly
false
against the peace and dignity of the State of

Dollars, unless Jerry Leath appears at the next
term of the Circuit-Court, at Bay Minette, in
Baldwin County, Alabama, and from day to day
and from term to term thereof, until discharged
by law, to answer a complaint against him
in said Court, for the offence of Perjury.
And we, and each of us, hereby waive all rights
to claims of exemption we or either of us have
now or may hereafter have under the Constitution
and Laws of Alabama, and we hereby severally
certify that we have property free from all
incumbrance to the full amount of the
above Bond.
