Be it remembered that at a regular
term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County Alabama
held at the said Court House of said County, on
the fourth Monday of October A.D. 1910, the same
being the 24th day of said month, His Honor
Samuel B. Brown Judge presiding and also were
present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of
said County

Prior to the adjournment of the last term of
this Court, to wit: on the 7th day of April A.D. 1910,
the Judge of this Court drew from the jury box,
in open Court fifty cards, on each of which
was a name to supply the Grand Jury for
this term and Petit Jurors for the first
week, and the names of the persons drawn
are: Jesse C. Nelson, John M. Bishop, Noah Wiley,
Leslie H. Bryars, Sam Martin, George Miller James
Bradley, James O. Stapleton, Sam McParson, George
W. Ward, Chas. Wilson, J. Richard Lettelle,
Henry Simpson, John B. Shipp, Wm. H. Sanders,
Darius Stegall, Sara Cline, Arthur Dixon
James R. Sammett, Pittman Lambert, Jesse
Batson, J. B. Johnson, Paul Rolf Douglas
Durant, Randolph McGowan, Joseph B. Hunter,
James Hollingsworth, John Pittman, J. M. Bishop,
Cleveland Bellum, H. Barnette, Rose L. Ligon, John B.
Gurden, Frank P. Redmond, Chas. P. Phillips,

Allen L. Shines, Chas. P. Hanson, G. Ed. Burgett, Jay B. McSherr, and the Judge placed them in a paper envelope sealed safe, and on the 4th day of October 1910, delivered them to the Clerk of the Court, who issued to the Sheriff a venire facias containing the names of the persons drawn the day that are to appear, their occupation, and the place of business and residence.

And now comes Thos. A. Booth, Sheriff of said County and returns into Court his venire facias served upon all of said jurors, except Wm. Sileo, H. Lee Perry, G. Ed. Burgett and Leslie H. Bryan, all of whom answered to their names except James C. Stapleton, John B. Shipp, Sam. L. Crane, Arthur Nixon, and it appearing to the Court that said persons have a good and sufficient excuse for their non-attendance, at this term of the Court it is ordered that they be and are excused, and the following of said persons so drawn and summoned viz: Henry Gibson & Jesse Dapton, John Dillingham Jr., Wm. L. Barnett, Rose Elise, appeared and in open Court submitted reasons why they should not serve as jurors, it is ordered that they be and are hereby excused.

And now after hearing all excuses, claims of exemptions and disqualifications, and passing upon the same it appears to the Court that there are not enough qualified jurors in attendance upon the Court to form the juries required the Judge of the Court drew from the jury box the names of the following jurors viz: George Humphries, Ollona Higgins, Barthus Erwin, Herbert Billcase, John Schumaker, E. L. Jones, John Miller, James M. Thompson, John S. Campbell, Benjamin Britz, Orville Hall, Sam. Burns, James L. Brown, Morgan Nixon and Quatrows, Will Bromastie, Ward Woolley, J. P. Mix, who were then within or within five

miles of the Court House, to complete all juries, then required
 the Sheriff forthwith to summon such jurors to attend Court in-
 stantly. And now on this the 24th of October 1910, The Judge
 presiding in open Court required all the persons in attendance
 upon the Court named in the venire to be called and after
 hearing excuses claimed of exemption and disqualifications,
 and passing upon the same. Caused to be placed in a hat
 the cards containing the names of all the persons present, who
 were not excused by the Court, on exempt or disqualified
 and the Judge first drew therefrom eighteen of said
 cards containing the following names, Jay P. Whip,
 Will J. Cromartie, Elmer P. Hanson, Allen C. King, Christopher
 Columbus Rodgers, Robert L. Pullford, Giles L. Phillips, James
 Holton Brasley, R. Douglas Durant, Richard B. Daggelle, Chas. H.
 Davison, John Dyess, John W. Baggett, Ray Brewton, Sam. Burns,
 Jay B. McShaw, Arrie C. Stall, and George Humphries, who had
 composed the Grand Jury for this term, and it
 appearing to this Court, that the Grand Jury is now
 complete and is composed of the said eighteen
 named jurors, the Court appointed George W. Hum-
 phries as foreman of the Grand Jury and
 administered to him the oath as set forth
 in section 7284 of the Criminal Code of
 Alabama, while the oath set forth in
 section 7285 was duly administered to the
 other Grand Jurors, and W. A. Wilkins was
 sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the
 Grand Jury, thus organized, who being duly
 charged in reference to the business to be
 transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury room,

And the said Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this indictment, and since August 25th 1909 Warrine Lee sold, offered for sale, kept for sale or other unlawful disposition or otherwise disposed of prohibited liquors and beverages.

3 And the said Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th Warrine Lee sold offered for sale, kept for sale, or other unlawful disposition, or otherwise disposed of spirituous, vinous, or malt liquors contrary to law.

4 And the said Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th 1909 Warrine Lee maintained an unlawful drinking place, contrary to the statutes in such case made and provided.

5 And the said Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this indictment and since August 9th 1909 Warrine Lee carried on the business of a retail dealer in liquors, or of a retail dealer in malt liquors.
