The State of Alabama, (Circuit Court
Baldwin County) Spring Term, 1909.

To any sheriff of the State of Alabama, - Greeting:

It having been made known to the Court, by competent evidence that heretofore, viz: On the 28th day of March, 1908, a subpoena issued out of this Court, directed to Charity Harris commanding her to appear at the Fall term 1908 of this Court, to give evidence in behalf of State in a case pending in this Court, wherein The State of Alabama is plaintiff and Roland Rice is defendant. And it appearing to the Court, by return of the Sheriff on said Subpoena endorsed, that the said Charity Harris was duly summoned to appear at said term, and from term to term thereafter, according to law; And it further appearing that the said Charity Harris has wilfully refused to appear and testify as by said Subpoena she was required, and wilfully and without good excuse refused to appear, in obedience to said Subpoena; You are, therefore, Commanded to arrest the said Charity Harris and her safely keep, so that you have her before this Court on the 29th day of March, 1909.
