 Sheriff of said County when the following proceedings were had:

 into Court his Venire Facias served upon the following good

 accordance with law to serve as Grand Jurors at the present

 tired under the charge of D. C. Byrne who had been duly
 appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said
 Grand Jury.

And said Grand Jury further charge that before the finding of this Indictment, Eddie Wise with intent to steal broke into and entered the dwelling house or shop or store or other building of Joseph Sadika in which goods merchandise or clothing, things of value were kept for use, sale or deposit.

4. And the Grand Jury of said County further charge that before the finding of this Indictment, Eddie Wise, with intent to steal broke into and entered the dwelling house or store or shop or other building of Joseph Sadika in which goods, merchandise or clothing, things of value were kept for use, sale or deposit, against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
