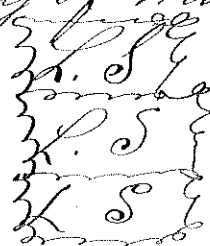

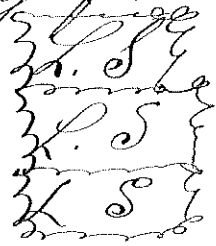

And said Grand Jury further Charge that, before the finding of this Indictment William Pruden sold, gave away or otherwise disposed of "White Top" "Heard Beer" a beverage which is the product of Maltose or genecose or in which Maltose or genecose is a substantial ingredient in Baldwin County, Alabama, being a place where the sale of spirituous, vinous or malt liquors is prohibited by law, which offense was committed subsequent to the 1st day of January, 1909, against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
