the offense of Carrying Concealed Weapons.

And we and each of us, hereby waive all rights to claim
of exemption we or either of us have now or may hereafter
have under the Constitution and Laws of Alabama, and we
hereby severally certify that we have property free from all
incumbrance to the full amount of the above Bond.

Affidavit The State of Alabama, Justice Court of
Baldwin County

Personally appeared before me, D. C. Payne, J. P. & off
Justice of the Peace in and for said County Julius Richerson who
being duly sworn says on oath that he had probable cause for
believing and does believe within 12 months before making of this
affidavit in said County that Dallas Foster with intent to steal
did break into and the store house of Tompkins & Richerson
in which goods and merchandise were kept for sale and took
and carried away therefrom one watch & chain, some finger
rings, one razor & 2 pairs of shoes of the value of twenty six dollars
the personal property of Tompkins and Richerson against the
peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.

Organization
of Court and
Grand Jury

The State of Alabama, (Circuit Court
Baldwin County) Full Term, 1908

Be it remembered that a Court was begun and
held for the County of Baldwin, State of Alabama, on the Fourth
Monday in October, 1908, the same being the 26th day of the
month; His Honor Saml. B. Browne, Judge Presiding, also
were present the Clerk of said Court and the Sheriff of said
County, when the following proceedings were had:

And now comes Thomas A. Booth, Sheriff of said County
and returns into Court his venire facias served upon
the following good and lawful men who had been duly and
regularly drawn in accordance with law to serve as
Grand Jurors at the present term of the Circuit Court
to wit: C. S. Tompkins, P. W. McAdams, John Mobley,
J. T. Bradley, Chas. Head, James Byers, Jos. Fennear,
M. O. Underwood, Oscar Johnson, F. D. Group, Thos. Hadley,
W. B. Gunn, G. B. Childress, W. B. Thornley, N. Marshon,
G. R. Suarez, J. P. Lipscomb & Tillman Lambert. All of whom
answered to their names except M. O. Underwood and proof
having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that the said
M. O. Underwood has a good and sufficient excuse for
his non-attendance, It is ordered by the Court that he
be and is excused, It is further ordered by the Court
that P. W. McAdams (who was present in Court) be and he
is excused upon a sufficient excuse being rendered
And the following of said persons so summoned to

serve as Grand Jurors, were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally impanelled, sworn and charged by the Court, J. T. Bradley having been appointed and sworn by the Court as Foreman of said Grand Jury: C. C. Tompkins, John Mobley, Chas Head, James Byars, Joe Gemmeau, Oscar Johnson, Ed Troup, Thos Hadley, W. B. Childress, W. B. Thornley, St. Marshon, G. R. Suarez, W. Lipscomb, and Tillman Lambert. And the said Grand Jury then retired under the charge of W. C. Booth, who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand Jury.

And the said Grand Jury among other indictments returned the following:

Indictment, The State of Alabama, Circuit Court
Dale County, Fall Term 1908.
The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this indictment Dallas Foster with intent to steal broke into the shop or store of Thompson & Richardson, a partnership composed of C. C. Tompkins and E. M. Richardson (the title to the realty being in Florence Tompkins) in which goods or merchandise, things of value were kept for use, sale or deposit, against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
