Comes J. B. Stapleton one of the plaintiffs in the above styled ^{cause} and for himself and his co-plaintiffs therein, with by himself and counsel, and moves the court for a retaxation of the costs in said cause.

And he alleges that the said bill of costs in said cause and causes, there being two of them, is excessive in charging fees for witnesses who were not examined therein, and also for taxing fees for witnesses more than two of whom were called to prove one particular fact; and for charging by error for witnesses never subpoenaed in said cause or causes; Also for taxing items of costs contrary to law.

And moveant alleges that he is entitled to a credit on the bill of costs in this case to the amount of about thirty five dollars, the same being the amount of costs in the prior one of the two said suits, and which was paid by plaintiffs prior to the bringing of the second of said suits and which credit is not allowed on the said present bill of costs.

And plaintiff alleges that he is ready and willing to pay the proper bill and amount of said costs and here brings into court the amount of money necessary so to do.
