Hans Lindoerfer is over the age of twenty-one years and a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama, residing at Elberta. He has been a resident of said county for more than fifteen years next preceding the filing of the Bill of Complaint in this cause. The said Hans Lindoerfer and I were married on June 13th, 1933, and lived together as man and wife from that time and until March 11th, 1939, when I was compelled to leave him and live separate and apart from him; that on March 11th, 1939, the said Hans Lindoerfer struck me in the face with his hand and threatened to choke the life out of me; that from his conduct I had reason to believe that he would commit further violence on my person, attended with danger to my life or health.
