



Dear Sir:-

Your wife has employed us to obtain a divorce for her, and we are enclosing herewith a copy of the bill filed against you. If she had been of a mind to claim it, the law allows her, as a matter of right, temporary alimony, and there is usually also an allowance made for attorneys' fees, and costs of court; and permanent alimony, when the divorce is granted. You will observe, however, that she has asked for none of these things, and you will not be put to any expense in the procuring of the divorce. She informs us that she does not think that you will be opposed to her getting a divorce, as there is no prospect that you will ever live together again. It will save some expense and enable her to get a divorce quicker and be no disadvantage to you, if you will sign the enclosed ~~papers~~ and return them to me. Of course if any resistance is offered, we shall advise her to claim all that she can, and you would be put to considerable expense, even though she did not succeed in getting the divorce, and I will state in this connection, that when temporary alimony was allowed, if you did not comply with the order of court to pay same, and were shown to be able to do so, the Court would treat it as a contempt, and put you in jail until you had complied with the order.


