Street and the Complainant shall have the custody of Lena Street and the custody of said minor children is so awarded until a further modification of this decree as to said oustody if the said decree on further consideration be modified but it is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that either of said parents shall have the right to visit any of said minors at any reasonable and all times.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that Respondent shall pay costs of this suit, for which execution may issue.

He had frequently before that time committed personal violence but never so bad as at that time. He drove me away from him and it will be very dangerous for me to attempt to live with him again.

#### FOURTH

There were four children born of my marriage with the respondent, William Hurley Street, namely, a boy named Hilliard Vaughan Street, who was eleven years old when this bill was filed, a girl named Jessie Margaret Street, who was nine years old when this bill was filed, a girl named Helen O. Street, who was four years old when this bill was filed and a girl named Lena Alneta

Street, who was one year old when this bill was filed. All of said children have lived with their father since the separation except the youngest one, who is living with me, and the father refuses to let the other children live with me. He is an ablebodied man capable of making a good salary and he does make money and I have nothing on which to live. He has done nothing towards my support since the separation.

On cross-examination the witness testified:

I do not know to what extent the respondent has been farming or working out since our separation but I do know that he has been building a house for someone. The place we lived on while we were together was about a mile and a half back in the country, southeast of Zundels and in the Foint Clear district. I have not gone back to him or lived with him since June of 1920, because I cannot do so with safety. When I left him he beat me, hitting me more than one time; the first lick dezed me. Then the hit me under the chin and bruised and choked me. At that time I left him and have been away from him ever since.
