are held and firmly bound unto the Town of Alberta in the sum of 300.00 dollars, for the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents.

Witness our hands and seals, this the 28 day of July 1956

The condition of the above obligation is such, that,

whereas, the above bounden Elmer Cooper was, on the 28 day of July, 1956 convicted in the Municipal Court of said Town of Alberta, of the offense of D.V.I., and by the judgment of said Court sentenced to the payment of a fine of 100.00 dollars.

and, whereas, the said Elmer Cooper has this day prayed on appeal from said judgment to the Circuit Court of said County.

Now, if the said Elmer Cooper shall appear at the next term of the Circuit Court, and from term to term thereafter until discharged, and abide by and perform whatever sentence may be adjudged in said Court against him, then the above obligation ~~shall~~ be void; otherwise to remain in full force and effect; and each of us to waive our ~~exemptions~~ as to personal property.
