


The plaintiff claims of the defendant the sum of One Thousand One Hundred Twenty-five & 27/100 Dollars, due by promissory notes made by the defendant on the 7th day of February, 1952 and the 2nd day of June, 1953, and payable on the 1st day of June, 1952, and the 2nd day of November, 1953, respectively, with interest from the 7th day of February, 1952, and the 2nd day of June, 1953, respectively, at the rate of Six (6%) per cent. per annum.

II.

The plaintiff claims of the defendant the sum of One Thousand One Hundred Twenty-five & 27/100 Dollars, due by promissory notes made by the defendant on the 7th day of February, 1952, and the 2nd day of June, 1953, and payable on the 1st day of June, 1952, and the 2nd day of November, 1953, respectively, with interest from the 7th day of February, 1952, and the 2nd day of June, 1953, respectively, at the rate of Six (6%) per cent. per annum.

Plaintiff avers that in and by the terms of said notes the defendant waived all right to exemption under the constitution and laws of the State of Alabama, and of this waiver plaintiff now claims benefit.

Plaintiff further avers that in and by the terms of said notes, the defendant agreed to pay all costs of collecting or securing, or attempting to collect or secure said notes, including a reasonable attorney's fee, and the plaintiff further claims of the defendant the further and additional sum of Two Hundred & NO/100 Dollars, as such reasonable attorney's fee.
