COUNT ONE

Greer, doing business as co-partners under the firm name and style of Autry Greer & Sons and who was then and there acting within the line and scope of her employment as such, did negligently close the door to said store, and as a proximate result of said negligence, the said door hit a Coca Cola bottle from which Plaintiff was drinking; and as a proximate result thereof Plaintiff's two central incisor teeth were fractured; hence this suit.
