

Mrs. Anna Ulitzsch being duly sworn deposes and says as follows:

My name is Anna Ulitzsch. I am over the age of twenty-one years and
reside in Baldwin County, Alabama. I have resided in Baldwin County,
nearly six years continuously, next preceding the filing of this suit
for divorce against Herman Ulitzsch. Herman Ulitzsch is a resident of
Amboy in the state of Illinois. He is over the age of twenty-one years.
In 1910 Herman Ulitzsch, Respondent and I were married in Illinois.
We moved to this state and county about six years ago where I have re-
sided continuously since. In January 1922 we resided at Foley in this
County. That in said month January 1922 the said Herman Ulitzsch vol-
untarily abandoned me without any cause or provocation. The abandonment
took place in this county at Foley. That upon the abandonment the said
Herman Ulitzsch went to the North and has worked about from place to
place and has failed and refused to provide a home or contribute to her
support, though she has repeatedly urged him to do so. That during
their married life the Defendant was quarrelsome and often abused me,
and called me insulting names and that just prior to his abandonment he
became angry with me and struck me over the head and in the face and
inflicted a dangerous wound ~~over my~~ ^{to} ~~my~~ right eye, and I am still
having trouble with my eye because of the injury. That the Defenant
and I have not lived together as husband and wife since his aforesaid

abandonment in 1922.

Anna Ulitzsch

F. W. Walker, a witness for the Complainant being duly sworn deposes and states as follows:

My name is F. W. Walker. I reside at Foley in Baldwin County, Alabama. I have known both the Respondent and Complainant for more than three years. In January 1922, Defendant Herman Ulitzsch left Foley and has not returned since that time. During the whole of such period Mrs. Ulitzsch has remained at Foley. Mrs. Ulitzsch is and has been since I have known her a woman of good reputation and character. Since Mr. Ulitzsch went away he has not provided a home for Mrs. Ulitzsch, nor so far as I know contributed to her support.

F. W. Walker

Mrs. Wilhemina Rosenberger, a witness for the Complainant being duly sworn deposes and states as follows:

My name is Wilhemina Rosenberger. I live at Elberta, in Baldwin County, Alabama. I have known Mrs. Ulitzsch since she has been residing in this county, more than three years before the commencement of this suit. Mr. Ulitzsch went away about January 1922, and has remained away continuously since that time. Mrs. ^{*Ulitzsch*} has lived in this county continuously since Mr. Ulitzsch went away. She has been working to support her self. Since Mr. Ulitzsch went away, he has not provided Mrs. Ulitzsch with a home and so far as I know he has ^{*not*} contributed to her support in any way. Mrs. Ulitzsch has been a resident of Baldwin County continuously since she moved here in 1917.



AGED MAN RISKS LIFE ON ICE TO RESCUE A PUPPY

Detroit, Mich., Jan. 24.—An 8 month old Airedale puppy, frozen to the ice in the Detroit river and howling for help, was rescued Sunday by a 64 year old man, who, risking his life on the treacherous broken ice, crawled to the dog, chopped it free, bundled it in a blanket, and brought it safe to shore. The story was told today by friends of Dr. R. Adlington Newman, to whom Jerry, the puppy, owes its life.

Dr. Newman saw the dog, attempting to cross the ice, slipping and falling and becoming more and more frightened as the chill of the zero wind gradually benumbed its legs.

"I love dogs," Dr. Newman said today, "and I couldn't endure the thought of watching this fine puppy die. I tied a rope around my waist and asked a policeman to hold the other end. Then I worked my way over the ice, pushing a skiff ahead of me, and at length reached the

Dear Sir:-

Your letter of April 29th 1924, received which I am greatly suprised that my dear wife Anna Ulitzsch, Foley, Ala, is suing for divorce. As items I will mention from year 1918, moth October myself volunteered for War Service, labor department at Chicago, Illinois, came home from Rossville, Ill., one or two days after that Constable from Danville, Ill., appeared at the house in the evening at 6 o'clock P.M. had a suit against me from Norris Alister & Ball Co., Chicago, Ill., for my delinquency of paying a bill which owed them. That same evening 9:30 o'clock P.M. I retired, my dear wife came into the room, thought I was asleep, got a pistol laying there, saying going out of the room again, "One of us had to go". Waiting a little while I got up going to room where she retired found this pistol under her bed loaded, took it and hid same, but paid my bill which I owed Norris Alister & Ball Co., and then went and served the U.S.A. sending her money, nearly half of every weeks pay \$24.00, about from \$10.00 to \$12.00 per week she got. I got down to Foley, Ala., Sept., 1920 and lived with her in 1921. We were digging out a post for our mail box one night, had it partly dug out, she was helping me, told her a minute before it happened to look out, she did not obey and the shapr edge of the post took her across the right eye, stunned her and I picked her up. Do not know of beating her in shape or form in living with her. Jan.19,1922 at Foley,Ala., I lost over \$900.00 watch makers tools and material belonging to me through a fire, had no insurance. In the later part of February 1922 I went up to Chicago, Ill doing little odd jobs here and there up to May 1, 1922 found work in Auto factory Elgin Six Car Corporation, at Argo, Ills.

I sent her Argo Bank draft to my dear wife, \$12.00 to \$14.00 per week up to Aug., 1 1922 and asking her to come up at once, bring little dog and furniture and keep house for me there after Aug., 1 ,1922 the factory went broke and we were laid off. I went down to Cresent City, Ill., in Aug. and took care of my dear mother's place while residing there I received a telegram from my dear wife to come at once bring W.Letters but did not go. In October 1922 I went to Forrest, Ill., picked up my trade as Watchmaker & Jeweler sent her a draft for \$25.00 from the Farmer's Bank to come up and keep house for me, rented a house paid \$15.00 per month Nov. and Dec. 1922 and Jan. 1923 and then my dear wife did not come up. In the month of May 1923 I sent her \$45.00 and a pair of shoes, registered \$10.00 draft of the Farmer's Bank and one personal check for \$35.00 drawn on the State Bank of Foley Ala., asking her to come up at once but did not come nor answer the letter. in Oct 1923 I joined the Loyal Order of Moose Lodge 890 Forrest, Ill., and am very proud of it and have an Old Peoples Home Moose Haven, Fla. In month of Feb. 1924 I took out a \$1500.00 Policy in the Prudential Insurance Company-20 year life- in my dear wife's favor, besides I am carying \$1000.00 in Columbian National Life in her favor. Was appointed by Webb C. Ball Time Service of Chicago, Ill., to go over from Forrest, Ill. to Amboy, Ill., to take care of the Illinois Central R.R, as Watch Inspector which I am now doing. As I have found out through another party the little dog was sick and she, my dear wife, took it to some where else and had it shot instead of having the little dog cured. Find enclosed a little news paper paragraph. Dr. Newman risks life on ice to rescue a puppy. My dear wife instead of having it cured of its sickness had it shot and how it must have howled before it gave up its life.

I will keep the corpus and writ here till I hear from
you.
