Dear Sir:

With this I hand you complaint and summons in the case of John Slavick vs Magdalena Freidenberg, which please file, also affidavit and bond for attachment. The property levied on can be turned over to the Plaintiff against his receipt and I will then ask for an immediate order of sale as soon as you notify me that the levy has been made and upon what property.

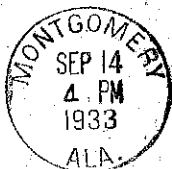
Dear Sir :
