TO THE HONORABLE HUBERT M. HALL, JUDGE OF THE TWENTY-EIGHTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT OF ALABAMA:

The State of Alabama, on the relation of MacDonald Gallion, as its Attorney General, gives the Court here to understand and be informed as follows, to-wit:

- l. That your relator is the duly qualified and elected Attorney General of the State of Alabama, and has been and is now acting in said capacity in this proceeding.
- 2. Your relator gives the Court to further understand and be informed, and does aver that Bertrand Goldberg in said County of Baldwin within the three years last passed, has intruded and is intruding into the profession of architecture by engaging in the planning or designing for the erection, enlarging or alteration of a building or buildings for others, or by furnishing architectural supervision of the construction thereof (a profession requiring a license or certificate or other legal authorization within this State), without having obtained a certificate of registration from the State Board for the Registration of Architects of the State of Alabama, or the license required by law, and is still unlawfully practicing said profession in Baldwin County, Alabama.

- 3. Your relator gives the Court to further understand and be informed, and does aver that Bertrand Goldberg, doing business as Bertrand Goldberg Associates, in said County of Baldwin within the three years last passed, has intruded and is intruding into the profession of architecture by engaging in the planning or designing for the erection, enlarging or alteration of a building or buildings for others, or by furnishing architectural supervision of the construction thereof (a profession requiring a license or certificate or other legal authorization within this State), without having obtained a certificate of registration from the State Board for the Registration of Architects of the State of Alabama, or the license required by law, and is still unlawfully practicing said profession in Baldwin County, Alabama.
- 4. Your relator further avers that the defendant,
 Bertrand Goldberg, is over the age of twenty-one years and is a
 non-resident of the State of Alabama, and that the present
 post office address of said defendant, Bertrand Goldberg, is
 "Bertrand Goldberg Associates, Architects and Engineers, 721
 North Michigan Avenue, Chicago 11, Illinois."

WHEREFORE, THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, YOUR RELATOR PRAYS:

- 1. That process may issue as provided by law, requiring and commanding the said Bertrand Goldberg to show cause by what warrant or authority he is practicing said profession.
- 2. That the said Bertrand Goldberg be excluded from said profession and be prohibited from practicing the same in the State of Alabama, until he shall have complied with the law.
- 3. That all such other, further and different orders and processes be made and issued by the Court, as the statutes in such cases provide and that Your Honor will grant unto your relator such other, further and different relief as the nature of the case may require.

4. That service of process upon the defendant, Bertrand Goldberg, may be had in accordance with the provisions of Title 7, Sections 201, 202, Code of Alabama 1940.

Trial of this action by jury is demanded.

- 1. For that it does not set forth facts sufficient to constitute a cause of action against this defendant.
- 2. For that it does not concisely and clearly set forth the act or omission complained of.
 - For that it is indefinite and uncertain.
- 4. For that it is vague, ambiguous and does not conform with the requirements of Title 7, Section 1144, 1940 Code of Alabama, as last amended.
- 5. For that the act or omission complained of does not appear with sufficient certainty.
- 6. For aught that appears, the time within which this action was brought has expired.
- 7. For aught that appears, said action is barred by the statute of limitations.

- 15. For aught that appears, the act complained of consisted of making plans and specifications for a building upon a farm for the use of a farmer.
- 16. For aught that appears, the act complained of consisted of making plans and specifications for a one or two family residence building costing less than Ten Thousand and No/100 (\$10,000.00) Dollars.

- 17. For aught that appears, the act complained of consisted of making plans and specifications for a domestic outbuilding appurtenant to a one or two family residence costing less than Ten Thousand and No/100 (\$10,000.00) Dollars.
- 18. For aught that appears, the act complained of consisted of making plans and specifications for a building costing less than Ten Thousand and No/100 (\$10,00.00) Dollars which was not a school, auditorium or any other building intended for the mass assemblage of people.

Comes now each of the defendants in the above case,
Bertrand Goldberg and Bertrand Goldberg, doing business as
Bertrand Goldberg Associates, and, for answer to the petition
and to each count and paragraph thereof, separately, does
allege the following:

- 1) Said defendant is over the age of twenty-one (21) years and is a non-resident of the State of Alabama. The defendant admits that the relator is Attorney General for the State of Alabama.
- 2) For further answer to the petition, the defendant alleges that he is and was, at all times mentioned in said petition, a duly licensed and registered architect and engineer in the State of Illinois; that he is and has been in independent practice as such architect and engineer for more than ten (10) years in said state, and has in his employment, a large number of well trained, experienced, and qualified engineers, architects and other persons; that he was retained to perform certain work in Baldwin County, Alabama, and that, in the furtherance of such employment, and in cooperation with several engineering firms, he prepared a number of plans and drawings. These firms

were James N. Garrett and Associates of Mobile, Alabama; Eustis Engineering Company of New Orleans, Louisiana; and National Pool Engineers, Inc. of Florence, Alabama. Several of these firms have now and did have associated with them professional engineers, registered in the State of Alabama, and all of said plans as to which it was proper or advisable were examined, approved, and sealed by Mr. Maurice W. Bryant, who is Registered Engineer Number 2774 of the State of Alabama.

- 3) Defendant further alleges that no building or buildings, as defined by the statutes of the State of Alabama, have been constructed in Baldwin County, Alabama, pursuant to any plans or designs prepared by the defendant. Accordingly, defendant denies that he has intruded or is intruding into the profession of architecture in the State of Alabama, and further alleges that if he has failed to comply with any laws of said state pertaining to the practice of architecture, such failure was the result of mere inadvertence on his part and that he acted at all times in the belief that his actions were proper and correct in every respect.
- 4) Nonetheless, defendant has, through his attorney-at-law, conferred with the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Alabama and also with the Board for Registration of Architects, and defendant's attorney has advised that defendant may have technically failed to comply with some provision of the statutes of the State of Alabama pertinent to this proceeding. Accordingly, defendant has made arrangements to present his qualifications to

the State Board for Registration of Architects and to apply for registration before that Board, which registration will make this pending proceeding moot. Therefore, in order to prevent the additional and needless expense which would otherwise be incurred in the defense of this action, defendant withdraws his demand for a jury trial herein and consents to the entry of a judgment in favor of the State of Alabama by the court in the above case.


