IT IS, THEREFORE, Ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court, that the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the Complainant and Defendant be, and the same are hereby dissolved, and the Complainant is forever divorced from the Defendant. *For and on account of Cruelty.*

It is further ordered and adjudged by the court that the complainant, Mrs. Mabel Addison Sandt is entitled to the custody and control of the minor children, ~~the~~ being named, Phillip A. Sandt and Samuel Sandt and the custody and control of the said minor children is hereby awarded to the complainant, Mrs. Mabel Addison Sandt.

It is further ordered, that the said Mrs. Mabel Addison Sandt be, and she is hereby permitted to again contract marriage, upon the payment of the costs of Court in this cause.

It is further ordered, that the said Mrs. Mable Addison Sandt pay the costs herein taxed, for which execution may issue, and if such execution is returned "no property found," then execution for such costs may issue against the said Phillip T. Sandt

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that said Mrs. Mable Addison Sandt shall not again marry except to said Phillip T. Sandt until sixty days after this date, and that if an appeal is taken within sixty days she shall not marry again except to said Phillip T. Sandt during the pendency of said appeal.

Testimony of Mrs. Mabel Addison Sandt:

My name is Mrs. Mabel Addison Sandt. I have lived at Fairhope, Baldwin County, Alabama, for a period of more than 12 months before this bill was filed for a divorce, and I am over the age of twenty-one years.

Phillip T. Sandt is my husband and I do not know where he now is. He is over the age of twenty-one years and was over this age at the time this bill was filed. I was over the age of twenty-one years at the time this bill was filed.

Phillip T. Sandt and myself were lawfully married more than 20 years ago and lived together as man and wife until a short time back; that on or about September 30th, 1922, Phillip Sandt struck me and caught me by the throat and threw me on the floor. I am not strong and was not at that time. I am very frail and weak and I came to Fairhope, Alabama to regain my health. Before coming to Fairhope and while we lived in New York Phillip Sandt threatened to kill me and he has constantly since he made the said threat been very cruel and harsh to me. His act in taking me by the throat and throwing me on the floor of my own house endangered my life or health and from the conduct and acts of Phillip T. Sandt I have reasonable apprehension of violence such as to endanger my life or health.

I am the mother of two minor children by the said Phillip Sandt which I know have in my custody and under my control and they are living with me in Fairhope, Alabama, they being Phillip A. Sandt age 13 and Samuel Sandt age 11. I can provide a home for them and maintain, educate and support the said children during their minority and give them the proper care and attention suitable to their condition in life. Phillip T. Sandt has no home and is continuously roaming over the country and he is not financially able to care for or provide for the said minor children.

Testimony of Mildred Sandt:

My name is Mildred Sandt. I am the daughter of Phillip T. Sandt and Mrs. Mabel A. Sandt. I am over twenty-one years of age. My father, Phillip Sandt, constantly cursed my mother Mabel A. Sandt and many times was he cruel to her. I have often heard him threaten to strike my mother, Mrs. Mabel Addison Sandt and it was dangerous for her to live with him. My mother is not very strong and in fact she is frail and weak. I heard the noise at the time my father, Phillip T. Sandt caught my mother by the throat and threw her on the floor and when I got to the scene my father, Phillip Sandt had let my mother alone. He abused her some after I got there. My mother is able to educate, care for and maintain the said minor children and to provide a home for them.

TO THE HONORABLE, JOHN D. LEIGH, JUDGE OF THE CIRCUIT COURT,
BALDWIN COUNTY, ALABAMA.---In Equity.

Your petitioner Mrs. Mabel Addison Sandt, respectfully represents and shows unto Your Honor as follows:

1. That she is a bona fide resident of the State of Alabama, residing at Fairhope in said County and State, and that she is over the age of twenty-one years; that she has been a resident of said County and State for a period of more than one year.

2. That Phillip T. Sandt is now residing at Fairhope, Baldwin County, Alabama, and is over the age of twenty-one years.

3. That your Oratrix and the said Phillip T. Sandt were lawfully married more than 20 years ago and lived together as man and wife until a short time ago; that on or about September 30th, 1922, the said Phillip T. Sandt struck your Oratrix by taking her by the throat throwing her around and unto the floor; that Oratrix is not very strong, and in fact is very frail, delicate and weak; that Oratrix came to Fairhope, Alabama for the purpose of regaining her health and the conduct of the said Phillip T. Sandt is often abusings and threatening Oratrix; that the said Phillip T. Sant has committed such actual violence on the person of Oratrix as to endanger her life or health and that from his conduct there is reasonable apprehension of such violence.

4. That your Oratrix is the mother of two minor children by the said Phillip T. Sandt and that she now has the said children under her control in the Town of Fairhope, Alabama, they being Phillip A. Sandt, age 13, Samuel Sandt, age 11; that your Oratrix can and will provide a home for the said minor children during their minority and see that they are properly educated and given the proper care and attention,

suitable to their condition and station in life.

That the said Phillip T. Sandt has no home at all and is continuously roaming over the country and is not financially able to care for said children.

PRAYER FOR PROCESS.

The premises considered, Oratrix prays that the said Phillip T. Sandt be made a party respondent to this bill of complaint by the usual process of this Honorable court, and that he be required to demur, plead to or answer the same within the time and under the penalties as provided by law, or that the same be forever confessed, and that such other orders and decrees may be issued necessary to obtain the relief prayed.

That upon the final hearing of this cause, Your Honor will grant unto Oratrix an absolute divorce from the said Phillip T. Sandt and that she be again allowed to contract marriage; that if your Oratrix be mistaken in the relief prayed, that Your Honor will grant unto her such other, further, different and general relief as she may in justice and equity be entitled, that Your Honor will grant unto Oratrix the control and custody of the said minor children.
