TESTIMONY OF ANNA KINNEY NOLTENSMEIER, the complainant and a witness for

the complainant, testifies as follows:- My name is Anna Kinney Noltensmeier and I am the wife of Henry C. Noltensmeier and the complainant in the above styled cause. I and the said Henry C. Noltensmeier are both over the age of twenty one years; I am a bona fide resident of Elberta in Baldwin County, State of Alabama where I have resided continuously for the past ten years; Henry C. Noltensmeier, while he was at Elberta in said Baldwin County, Alabama, at the time I filed my divorce, he moved away immediately and is a non-resident of the State of Alabama. When last heard of he was a resident of the State of Michigan, in the City of Detroit and his address was 13935 Hamilton Block, Highland Park, Detroit, Michigan.

I and the said Henry C. Noltensmeier were married in the month of May, 1918 at Elberta, Baldwin County, Alabama, and we lived together as man and wife until during the month of March, 1923.

After our marriage the said Henry C. Noltensmeier became addicted to habitual drunkenness. At the time of our marriage I did not know or even suspicion that my husband used liquor to any extent; he was not known as or reputed to be one who drank. In about the year 1921, about three years after we were married he began to drink whiskey and other liquors and in a regular manner. This habit of drinking gradually grew on him in spite of my entreaties and threats. He became a confirmed drunkard and was commonly known and referred to as such. Most of his time was spent in getting liquor and he would drink whiskey, beer and anything else that contained alcohol. He was so drunk most of the time that he was unable to work even if he had had the inclination. I was compelled not only to support myself but him as well.

By his promiscuous handling and drinking of liquors he not only brought himself and me into disrepute but placed me in serious danger of being removed as Post Mistress at Elberta, which position I have held for several years. This on account of the fact that I was compelled to carry on Post Office at my dwelling and his having the liquors around and being drunk were not only against Federal and State Laws but in violation of Postal Regulations which are very strict in regard to such matters. He became a confirmed drunkard and this occurred after our marriage. Conditions became so intolerable that we had to separate.

All of this occurred at Elberta, Baldwin County, Ala.

Anna Kinney Noltensmeier

MARGARET KELTZ, a witness for the complainant, testifies as follows:-

My name is Mrs. Margaret Keltz, I am a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama, living near Elberta. I have resided there about ten years and continuously except for a short trip North for about eleven months about five years ago.

I know both Anna Kinney Noltensmeier and her husband, Henry C. Noltensmeier. They are both over the age of twenty-one years. Anna Kinney Noltensmeier is a resident of Elberta, Alabama and has lived there for the past ten years to my certain knowledge. Henry C. Noltensmeier also lived and was a resident of Elberta and had lived there for many years. I remember when Mrs. Noltensmeier filed her divorce case and it was shortly after this that Henry C. Noltensmeier left Elberta and I was informed by his father that Henry C. Noltensmeier had gone to Detroit. I have not seen or heard of him being back in this state since that time.

I was at the wedding on May 5th., 1918 when Anna Kinney Noltensmeier and Henry C. Noltensmeier were married. They lived together as man and wife until in March, of this year, 1923.

After their marriage Henry C. Noltensmeier became addicted to habitual drunkenness. He was drunk more than half of his time. At the time of their marriage he was not a drunkard; I did not know nor had I heard up to that time of his drinking. After they had been married two years or more I noticed that he began to drink; this was very noticeable by ordinary observers and this habit of his seemed to grow on him. His condition became such that he was drunk more than half his time and was commonly reputed to be a drunkard. Drinking and being drunk became a confirmed habit with him and this all occurred in Elberta and after the said marriage.

Times after time I have remonstrated with him about his drinking and told him he should stop on account of his wife. He would reply that "You only live once. I am going to drink it as long as I can get it and as long as they make it I am going to get it."

I am not related to either party by blood or marriage.

Marguerite Keltz

CARL KOSS, a witness for the complainant testifies as follows:-

My name is Carl Koss. I am a resident of Elberta, Baldwin County, Alabama, where I have resided for the past four years continuously. I know both Anna Kinney Noltensmeier and her husband, Henry C. Noltensmeier. They are both over the age of twenty one years. Anna Kinney Noltensmeier is a bona fide resident of Elberta, Alabama where she has lived continuously for the entire time that I have been there, namely, four years; she is Post Mistress at said place. I remember when Mrs. Noltensmeier came to Bay Minette to start her divorce suit; shortly after she came back to Elberta Henry C. Noltensmeier, who had been a bona fide resident of that place up to that time, left and although I do not know of my personal knowledge where he went I have been informed that he went to Detroit Michigan.

I was not present at the marriage ceremony of these two parties but they were living together as man and wife when I came to Elberta. They continued to so live together until about March, 1923 when they separated.

I do not know whether Henry C. Noltensmeier was addicted to habitual drunkenness or not when he married for I did not know him then; I do know, however, that since I have been at Elberta he has drank a whole lot and his drinking grew from bad to worse and he became addicted to habitual drunkenness. He was drunk more than half of his time. His reputation was that of a common drunkard. I went ~~with~~ with him on one occasion to Pensacola, Florida and he was drunk when we went over and secured more whiskey and became still more intoxicated. I advised him on several occasions to quit his drinking. He would reply that he would drink it as long as it was made. He was either getting over an old drunk on getting on a new one all of the time.

I am not related to either of the parties by blood or marriage.

All of this occurred in Baldwin County Alabama.
