

DEMURRER

Comes now each of the following defendants, separately and severally, Tommie H. Scott, individually and operating under the name and style of Scott Produce Company, and Roy Edward McDonald, and demurs to the complaint as a whole and to each count of said complaint, separately and severally, and, for separate and several grounds of demurrer, sets down and assigns, separately and severally, the following:

- 1) For that it does not state facts sufficient to constitute a cause of action against this defendant.
- 2) For that it does not appear with sufficient certainty what duty, if any, this defendant may have owed to the plaintiff.
- 3) For that it does not appear with sufficient certainty wherein this defendant violated any duty owed by defendant to the plaintiff.
- 4) For that it does not sufficiently appear that this defendant owed any duty to the plaintiff which defendant negligently failed to perform.

- 5) For that the averments set up, if true, do not show any liability on the part of this defendant.
- 6) No facts are alleged to show that plaintiff sustained any damage or injury as the proximate result of any negligence or breach of duty on the part of this defendant.
- 7) It is not alleged with sufficient certainty where said accident occurred.
- 8) For aught that appears, plaintiff had no right to be where plaintiff was at the time and place of said accident.
- 9) It is not alleged that the negligence complained of proximately caused the accident and the injuries and damages complained of.
- 10) For that said count does not state a good cause of action against both defendants.
- 11) For that said count does not state a good cause of action against all defendants.
- 12) For that said count purports only to state a cause of action against the defendant Roy Edward McDonald.
- 13) For that said count purports only to state a cause of action against defendant Tommie H. Scott.
- 14) For that there is no allegation that the said Roy Edward McDonald operated a motor vehicle on a public highway or street.
